### *What can I expect at my first meeting?*

Caregiver support groups are structured around the needs of the members. Each group has trained volunteer facilitators to welcome the members and guide the discussion. Meetings last approximately 1-2 hours and occur once a month. Each member will be given the opportunity to introduce themselves, share about their situation and exchange creative caregiving tips.

Occasionally, guest speakers are invited to the support group to supplement current concerns of the members.

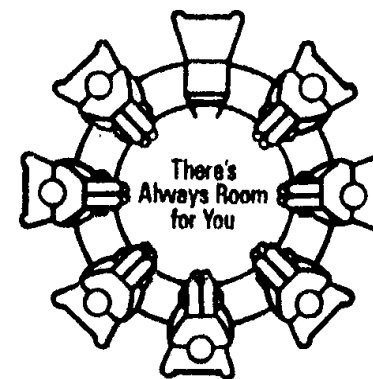
