

## Are you a Spouse Caregiver in a Late-life Remarriage? ('second' marriage)

Remarried spouse caregivers are invited to take part in a new study funded by the Alzheimer's Association.

This study is the first to focus on remarried spouses coping with memory loss and caregiving. Information from this study will help guide programs and service providers to better assist remarried caregivers and their family members.



### You are eligible to participate if:

- Your or your spouse/partner are in a late-life remarriage
- You provide primary care for spouse/partner with diagnosed memory loss, Alzheimer's disease or dementia .

Interviews will be conducted by telephone at a time selected by you. Questions will cover a wide range of topics, including caregiving experiences, social relationships and support networks, and well-being.

You will receive compensation for your time. Your spouse with memory loss will not be involved in this study.



Participation in this study is completely voluntary. You can refuse to answer any or all questions. All answers are kept strictly confidential and private, and the identity of participants will never be released.
