

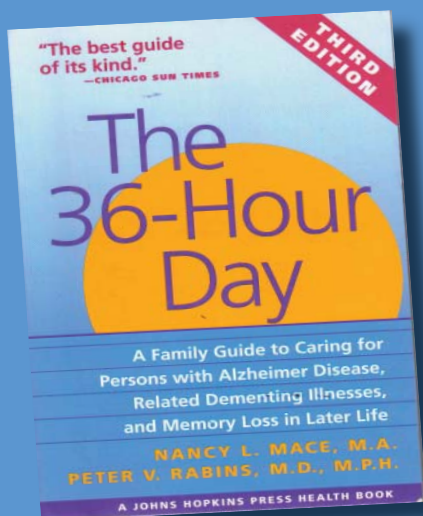

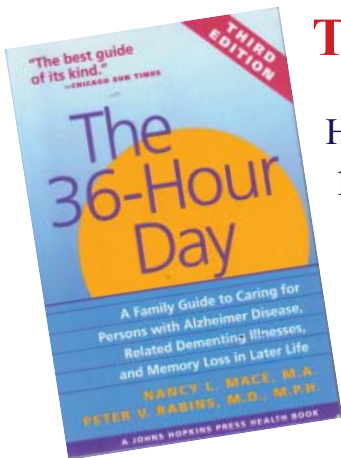

The 36-Hour Day: Past, Present, and Future

Hear Dr. Rabins, co-author of the well-known *36-Hour Day*, discuss:

- 1) The climate of dementia care in the early 80s when *The 36-Hour Day* was written,
- 2) The six “Rs” of behavior management and how most dementia care knowledge included in *The 36-Hour Day* is still relevant to present day dementia care, and
- 3) The future of dementia care regarding early detection and pharmacological advancements.



Dr. Rabins currently serves as Director of the Division of Geriatrics and Neuropsychiatry at Johns Hopkins University. He has focused his career on the study of psychiatric disorders in older persons. His current research focuses on the effectiveness of current therapies for Alzheimer’s disease, the development of measures of quality of life in persons with Alzheimer’s disease and care of patients with late stage dementia. He is also currently the Principal Investigator on an NINDS grant to assess care decisions in late stage dementia. He is also Vice Chair for faculty affairs in the Department of Psychiatry at Johns Hopkins.

The Future of Dementia Care: A Panel Discussion

As moderator, Dr. Lawhorne will lead the group of panelists to explore the upcoming trends, ramifications of those trends and how professionals can respond now to prepare for the future of dementia care. The six areas of discussion will include: medical advancements, increased number of seniors, regulations, health care system, technology and family issues.



Dr. Larry Lawhorne is currently the Director of the Department of Geriatrics, Boonschoff School of Medicine, Wright State University. He has served as a physician and teacher over the years. Starting in private practice as a family physician, he began to teach and continue his clinical practice. He then started work as a Medical Director at a LTC facility. He began teaching Family Practice at several institutions of higher learning. In 2000 he became Director at the Geriatric Education Center of Michigan while being the Medical Director at another facility. He assumed his current position in 2006. He is on the Editorial Board for the Journal of the American Medical Directors Association.

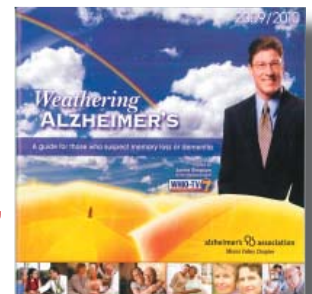

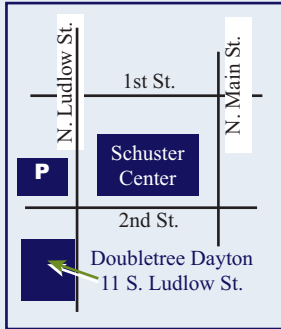
