Letter from Board Chair

This was quite the year to take on the Chairmanship of the Board of Directors for the Delaware Valley Chapter! You will read in this report about the tremendous effort made by the staff of the Chapter to maintain the programming at current levels – and even increase some programs – all while the economy fell into the cellar. Frankly, I would not have even joined the Board of Directors if I had not felt that the staff team was made up of top notch professionals. The last 15 months have proven to me that the incredible staff and volunteers use available resources with care, creativity, enthusiasm and professionalism.

This was quite a year that led to an increase in support groups by 33%! This translates to increasing the number of free support groups by 60 – on average more than 3 new support groups in each county served! Notwithstanding the time and energy it takes to manage each support group, but consider the sheer volume of increased need for the service.

This was quite a year to expand services for those in the Delaware Valley. In August, 2008 we reorganized our Program department to allow for a staff person to provide services specifically for those who are in the earliest stages of the disease. Through this change, we were able to increase the number of early stage support groups so that they now exist in each of the 18 counties that we serve. In addition to attending support groups alongside their caregivers, this growth has also made it possible for the persons with dementia to take advantage of new and innovative programs strategically designed just for them.

This was quite a year to be involved with the Alzheimer's Association Delaware Valley Chapter! The need is growing among families who are recognizing the early warning signs of dementia and taking advantage of all the Chapter offers. That's just what we want! Sadly, though, more people are facing this devastating diagnosis – at younger and younger ages. We even started support groups for children who are in middle school and high school who have parents with dementia!

I want you to know that the many volunteers, members of the Board of Directors and dedicated staff are doing everything humanly possible to ensure that vital services to families living with Alzheimer's disease continue. We will not give up the fight until we have a cure! We will not walk away from those families in need!

Yes, this was quite a year to take on the Chairmanship of the Board of Directors for the Delaware Valley Chapter!

Letter from President and CEO

The economic situation has undoubtedly affected us, as over 90% of our revenue is from private contributions from individuals, foundations and corporations. We have seen a drop in the average size of individual gifts but thankfully, we have a very broad base of donors who continue to support us! You will see on the financial pages later in this report how we used the many generous contributions we have received from individuals, corporations, and organizations who have supported our appeals, special events and events hosted on our behalf.

We took a proactive approach in the summer of 2008 by trimming costs in a number of ways. Doing that has enabled us to continue to provide many vital services for the community without having to lay off staff or cut their benefits. We are changing the way we publish our newsletter by transitioning into an on-line format more often. This saves the considerable expense of printing and mailing services. Given that our mailing list is more than 80,000, by even mailing only two per year and only to those who do not have internet access, or prefer hard copies, we will save more than \$75,000 in this next year alone.

Additionally, we have taken these spending reductions on a number of items including:

- Reorganizing the way we order and manage our supplies
- Streamlining staff travel and reducing the number of staff attending each event
- Leaving some non-essential positions unfilled or partially filled
- Reviewing contracts for services, requesting reductions or if necessary, finding less costly alternatives
- Eliminating non-essential expenditures
- Utilizing volunteers whenever possible

We have not reduced the following:

- The number of trainings we provide to local and state police, first responders or paramedics
- The amount of time our staff spends with families when a loved one is lost or the number of hours over the nights or weekends that staff carry the emergency MedicAlert® + Safe Return® on-call pager
- The number of scholarships for enrollment in the MedicAlert® + Safe Return® program
- Staff leadership and participation on County Safety Services Committees in Pennsylvania and New Jersey
- The number of training sessions available to family caregivers
- The hours that the Helpline is available to callers for questions about the disease and to provide them with comfort, suggestions and support.
- The amount of funds dedicated to peer-reviewed scientific research projects

We also want you to know that in 2009, \$0.80 of every dollar went directly to the educational programs, support services and research projects which are at the core of our mission. Only \$0.20 was spent on overhead and fundraising costs. We are proud to have been able to maintain such a strong performance in the face of our challenging economy.

Your support has been crucial this year, and for that we are truly grateful! I hope you enjoy reading about all the activities that occurred during the last fiscal year, and will consider increasing your support for fiscal year 2010.

Here’s why –

Many long-time supporters have now become Champions of the Alzheimer’s Association Delaware Valley Chapter who plan, coordinate and host events to raise money because they recognize that there is true cause for concern about Alzheimer’s disease. As champions, they know all too well that Alzheimer’s disease is not “just a normal part of aging”. There is a strong need to raise more awareness and concern, which hopefully will generate more funds for research advancements to help pinpoint a cause and eventually... find a cure.

Chapter supporters also recognize the need to sustain the programs and services that the Alzheimer’s Association provides. More than 294,000 individuals and their families living with Alzheimer’s or a related disorder in the Delaware Valley need a place to turn to for support. Monthly, the Chapter offers more than 240 support groups throughout the region, for members to share with others who understand what living with Alzheimer’s does to an entire family. With our community, family and professional education programs, led by professionals in the field, more people can learn to understand what to expect, where to go, and how to care for an individual who has Alzheimer’s disease or a related disorder.

Thanks to our loyal supporters, even when the economy plunged, the Delaware Valley Chapter proved that it wasn’t going to plunge with it. The Chapter showed promise in its programs and services... that the Delaware Valley Chapter would continue to be a pillar of strength, and deliver the best support possible to the community.

Kalin’s Backyard Carnival for Alzheimer’s

Friends and family of 14 year old Kalin Konrad rallied together to pull off the best backyard carnival in Kalin Carnival history. Kalin started her Backyard Carnival for Alzheimer’s when she was just 10 years old and has raised over \$10,000 total. She is also committed to participating in the Philadelphia Memory Walk where she brings some of her carnival games and along with her mother, runs the Kids’ Corner. Her parents—Bart and Diane Konrad have been instrumental because of their support, encouragement, dad’s game building skills and mom’s ability to help organize prizes, order food and help knock off items on long to-do lists.

Along with the support of her family, she acknowledges good friends, such as neighbors and community businesses that also help with the carnival each year. One of those friends, Jill Blackshaw ran a popular carnival game at Kalin’s Backyard Carnival as risk takers concentrate on where they should place their chips.

In uncertain times... thanks to the support of those who made a financial contribution, sponsored an education or special event, volunteered hours of service or donated goods or services, the Delaware Valley Chapter was able to not only continue to find ways to help families stay connected through the disease, but to do it well. Whether it was keeping memories alive through the Memories in the Making© arts program or providing care consultation, which helps families navigate through the difficult uncertainties and decisions people with Alzheimer’s and their families face at every stage of the illness, or through the Early Stage Support program, which offers the best ways to live with the disease, the Delaware Valley Chapter was on the MOVE to help those families living with Alzheimer’s cope as best they can.

The Chapter is happy to report that this past year the Delaware Valley Chapter realized...

- A 33% increase in support groups – including increasing those targeted to the individuals in the earliest stages of the disease and their families
- Serving 8,000 helpline calls on Helpline number 1.800.272.3900
- 312 new MedicAlert+ Safe Return® registrations, responding to 44 after hours wandering incidents
- 304 Police Officers trained
- 55 Care consultation visits
- Collaborations with cultural organizations in the community to help families stay connected

Education to family and professional caregivers is the foundation for providing the best possible care to persons with dementia. Each year the Delaware Valley Chapter offers an educational conference in Delaware, Southeastern Pennsylvania and South Jersey. These educational opportunities offer family and professional caregivers a chance to learn from highly acclaimed experts in the field of dementia. Each conference is generously sponsored by some of our corporate partners, who attend each event to provide up to date information on community resources and services available to our constituents.

Disease specific education is just one piece of what we do. There is a strong drive among Delaware Valley Chapter staff to assure that their concern and energy are contagious. That includes educating individuals about the importance of helping to advance research to find a cure, educating about how crucial it is to offer support to those living with the disease to make the quality of life better for them and their families, and educating individuals about ways to do as much as possible to promote brain health.



THE ALZHEIMER'S PROJECT

Claire Day Director Programs and Education made opening remarks at a local screening of the award winning HBO documentary series, “THE ALZHEIMER'S PROJECT” at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania. “THE ALZHEIMER'S PROJECT” got up front and personal with the faces behind the disease - and the forces leading us to find a cure. As the leading voluntary health organization in Alzheimer's care, support and research, the Alzheimer's Association played an active partner in “THE ALZHEIMER'S PROJECT,” providing expert insight and leading community engagement. Local researchers Dr. John Trojanowski and Dr. Virginia Lee from the University of Pennsylvania were featured in the documentary.

Not only did the Chapter see an increase in interest over last year, on average there was an increase of about 10% in event attendance.

During Memory Walk season, the Association relied strongly on volunteers and staff who worked hard on its five Memory Walks – Philadelphia, Atlantic City, Wilmington Rehoboth and Kutztown – to increase teams with the intent that revenue would meet ambitious goals. New walker teams came on board, and a spike in funds was realized.

South Jersey and Delaware golf events were well attended. Generous sponsors helped to keep costs to a minimum while gracious volunteers helped make the day enjoyable for golfers. Auctions and great food after a fine day of golf opened hearts and minds for those who remarked on what they were all in attendance to support.

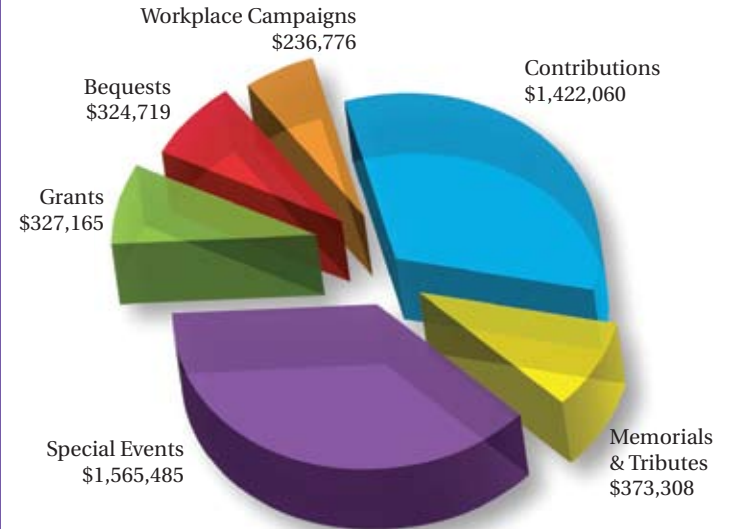

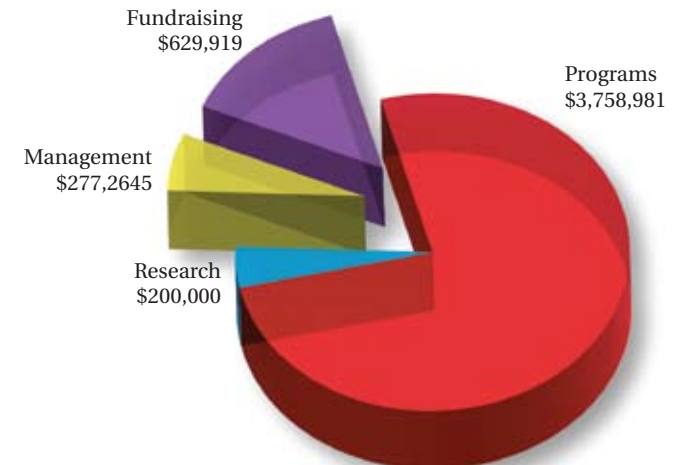
