



Kenny Alhadeff is part of a historic six generation Seattle family that owned and operated Longacres Race Course. He is chairman of Elttaes Enterprises and owner of the Majestic Bay Theatres. He attended Seattle Public schools, graduating from Franklin High and Washington State University.

He is a partner/producer of Junkyard Dog Productions, a theatrical producing organization dedicated to the development and production of new musical theatre. Projects include *MEMPHIS the Musical* - 2010 winner of four

TONY Awards including Best Musical, and *VANITIES*. Kenny and his wife, Marleen, are producing partners of The 5th Avenue Theatre.

He serves as board president of Northwest School for the Hearing-Impaired Children, board member of The 5th Avenue Theatre (chairman 2005-2007) and of Seattle Symphony, and past member of the board of regents of Washington State University (chairman 6/06-5/07 & 6/00-5/01). He is a past board member of Seattle Repertory Theatre, Cornish College of the Arts and was appointed as co-chairman of Governor Gardner's Commission for Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Events in the State of Washington.

Kenny and his wife, Marleen, established the Alhadeff Family Charitable Foundation in 1997. His passions for the Arts, for the importance of philanthropy, for the promotion of social justice and issues of addiction have brought him national acclaim as a public speaker. He has three children, a daughter-in-law and two grandchildren.
