**Alzheimer's Association's Memory Walk® 2009**

**Waterloo, Iowa, September 26<sup>th</sup>**- The Alzheimer's Association's annual Memory Walk® will take place on Saturday, September 26<sup>th</sup> at Hawkeye Community College in Waterloo. Nearly 500 people from the Greater Cedar Valley area are expected to participate in this year's event to raise awareness and funds to fight the disease.

The Alzheimer's Association's Memory Walk, nationally presented by Genworth Financial, is the nation's largest event to raise awareness and funds for Alzheimer care, support and research programs. Held annually in hundreds of communities across the country, this inspiring event calls on volunteers of all ages to become *Champions* in the fight against Alzheimer's. *Champions* include those living with the disease, families, caregivers, corporate and community leaders, who actively support Memory Walk in our community. Participants in Memory Walks across the United States have raised more than \$300 million.

The Cedar Valley Regional Memory Walk will begin at 9:00am, with check-in and registration to begin at 8:00am in Tama Hall. Participants can enjoy free food and beverages, live music by Checker and the Blue Tones, team photos, prize drawings, children's activities and yard games. The kick-off program will start at 8:45am with a personal testimony from a family caregiver, and then participants will be able to start their 1 or 3 mile walk.
