They urge adults not to make common assumptions about how they grieve and to treat the child with respect and patience.  <b>Movie #:</b> 377, 378</p>	<p><b>Alzheimer's: EMT recertification</b>  <b>Minutes:</b> 34  <b>Audience:</b> EMT's who want info on AD  <b>Summary:</b> A group of experts from Wesley Woods and Emory summarize the symptoms and diagnosis of A.D. Then, they show emergency scenarios with people who have Alzheimer's and how EMT's are supposed to respond.  <b>Movie #:</b> 385</p>
<p><b>AD Documentaries</b>  <b>Minutes:</b> 51  <b>Topic:</b> News clippings from the 1990's about AD  <b>Summary:</b> Clips about the following: the genetic role in early onset A.D. and if genetics plays a part in all A.D. cases, a woman with A.D. and how adult day care plays an important role in her life, the Wesley Woods facility, the brain autopsy, and general information on A.D.  <b>Movie #:</b> 390</p>	<p><b>Advanced Directives: The Adult Day Care Dilemma</b>  <b>Minutes:</b> 10  <b>Topic:</b> Should adult day centers address directives?  <b>Summary:</b> Advanced directives are a living will and a durable power of attorney. A doctor discusses whether it is the right of the adult day center to discuss advanced directives with the participants (this is the dilemma). <p><b>Alone: But Not Forgotten</b>  <b>Minutes:</b> about 30  <b>Topic:</b> Two stories about older adults with AD who live alone, and those who help them  <b>Summary:</b> 20% of people with Alzheimer's live alone. These people depend on others to help care for them. The Alzheimer's Demonstration Project was a grant that provided home care to live-alone seniors. (Doctors, legal/financial and safety issues), Treatment &amp; Management: Talks about Tacrine (outdated drug), and Issues &amp; Answers: Common questions about AD.  <b>Movie #:</b>543</p>

<p><b>Memory Lane: Family</b>  <b>Minutes:</b> 32  <b>Summary:</b> This video takes viewers for a stroll down Memory Lane. <p><b>The Faces of Alzheimer's: Many Voices, One Message</b>  <b>Minutes:</b> 10  <b>Audience:</b> Anyone interested in public policy  <b>Topic:</b> The 1991 Public Policy Forum  <b>Summary:</b> The importance of taking A.D. directly to elected leaders and the need for new public policy.  <b>Movie #:</b> 420</p>	<p><b>Facing Death Part 1: Providing Physical, Emotional &amp; Spiritual Comfort</b>  <b>Minutes:</b> 33  <b>Audience:</b> Those facing end-of-life or terminal illnesses  <b>Summary:</b> Covers pain management, stages of dying, spiritual comfort, caring for the patient, disfigurements, taking a break as a caregiver, humor and therapy. Very thoughtful and informative. NOT DEMENTIA SPECIFIC.  <b>Movie #:</b> 662</p>
<p><b>How to Have a Meaningful Visit with your Loved One at a Nursing Facility</b>  <b>Minutes:</b> 38  <b>Summary:</b> Developed specifically for family members who are looking for answers regarding what to expect when visiting a nursing or healthcare facility.  <b>Movie #:</b> 695</p>	<p><b>Freedom of Sexual Expression: Dementia and Resident Rights in Long Term Care Facilities</b>  <b>Minutes:</b> 16  <b>Summary:</b> This video promotes sex as a basic human need, even in LTC facilities. Shows examples of a visiting spouse pressuring his wife with AD to have sex, 2 unmarried people having sexual relations, a married man with dementia having sex with another resident, masturbation and same sex relations. Then the video shows family reactions to such situations.  <b>Movie #:</b> 450, 451</p>
<p><b>Fresh Approaches to Alzheimer's Care-Conference 5/3/01</b>  <b>Minutes:</b> 270  <b>Topic:</b> Conference on Alzheimer's and Caregiving  <b>Summary:</b> Conference in Calhoun, Georgia, that covers spirituality and AD, nutrition, Hospice, dementia, support groups, research and keynote speaker Virginia Bell.  <b>Movie #:</b> 661</p>	<p><b>From Here to Hope: The 3 Stages of Alzheimer's</b>  <b>Minutes:</b> 77  <b>Audience:</b> Especially family caregivers  <b>Summary:</b> The video is broken into 3 sections: late stages, middle stages and early stages.
