The Achievement Certificate in Alzheimer's Care Program

The Achievement Certificate Program in Alzheimer's Care is a comprehensive training course developed *to enhance* the quality of long-term care for people with dementia and Alzheimer's disease; *to improve* the caregiving experience for the professional; *to honor* the person with dementia; and *to create* the highest quality of life.

Participants in this course come from a wide diversity of cultural groups, socioeconomic backgrounds and gender. Yet we all share a common interest in learning to relate in a more satisfying and effective manner with all who are touched by dementia and Alzheimer's.

At the end of the training, participants will learn:

- ◆ The *differences* between normal aging, Alzheimer's disease and dementia
- ◆ *Effective* communication strategies
- ◆ To use an individual assessment of problems, retained skills, interests, and strengths to create *meaningful activity plans*
- ◆ Key approaches for working effectively with Activities of Daily Living
- ◆ To apply *problem-solving approaches* to challenging situations
- ◆ *Benefits* of family member participation
- ◆ How to *take a time-out* with the least amount of staff and resident disruption
