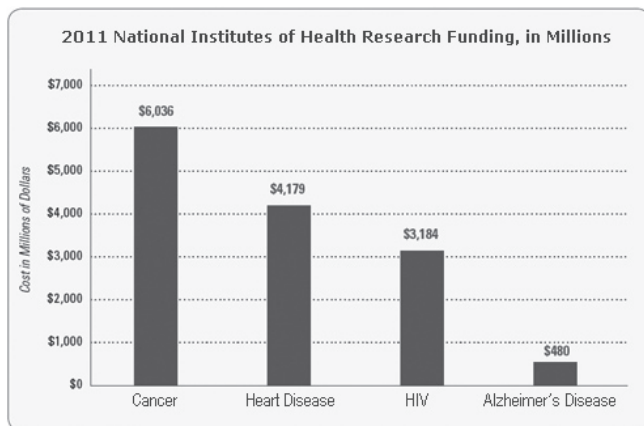

New 2011 Facts & Figures Released

According to the *Alzheimer's Association's 2011 Alzheimer's Disease Facts and Figures*, increasing evidence suggests that early diagnosis of Alzheimer's and timely intervention is beneficial, both for people with the disease and their caregivers.

Early diagnosis allows affected people, relatives and their caregivers to plan for the future, obtain medical care to manage symptoms and optimize function, and assists Alzheimer's families in taking steps to reduce the risk of accidents requiring further medical care.

“The Alzheimer's Association is committed to increasing awareness about the importance of early detection and diagnosis,” said Nikki Vulgaris-Rodriguez, executive director of the Central Illinois Chapter. “Our goal is to work with families in the community and connect them to local resources and services that help them to better understand and manage what Alzheimer's disease introduces into their lives. This knowledge can not only be empowering but extremely helpful to the whole family.”

Delays in diagnosis mean that individuals are not getting treatment in the earlier stages of the disease when they are most effective. They also miss the opportunity to make legal, financial and care plans.

With newly elected leaders in Congress, it is more important than ever that our representatives on Capitol Hill address the escalating Alzheimer epidemic. We need passionate advocates to come to Washington, D.C. for the Alzheimer's Association Advocacy Forum to make this case to their representatives, and to learn how they can be increasingly effective at advocacy year round. Please respond to Alzheimer's alerts as you receive them and make your voice known to your legislators.

New Progress, New Hope: Alzheimer's Research

Right now, we are in the midst of an exciting time. More than 100 research studies pertaining to Alzheimer's disease and related dementias are underway and recruiting volunteers. Alzheimer's Association TrialMatch™ is a free service that makes it easy for people with Alzheimer's, caregivers, families and physicians to locate clinical trials based on personal criteria (diagnosis, stage of disease) and location.

Alzheimer's Association TrialMatch lets you search these trials quickly and easily. It also narrows results to those trials where there is a reasonable chance to be accepted for enrollment. This saves time for both you and the researcher. Enrolling the right participants helps researchers accurately measure the effect of a treatment.

Importance of Clinical Trials

Clinical trials are the engine that powers medical progress. Through clinical trials, researchers test new ways to detect, treat and prevent Alzheimer's disease and related dementias. Without clinical trials, there can be no new treatments or cures. Over the last 15 years, scientists have made enormous strides in understanding how Alzheimer's disease affects the brain. Currently, the drugs available for the treatment of Alzheimer's only temporarily improve the symptoms of the disease; they do not stop the damage to brain cells that causes Alzheimer's to progress. But scientists believe that in the near future, therapies and treatments that slow or stop the progression of the disease will be available.

Ground-breaking research is going on that could have a measurable impact on the lives of current and future Alzheimer

patients. But a lack of volunteers for Alzheimer clinical trials is significantly slowing down this research and the development of new Alzheimer treatments. **Recruiting and retaining trial participants is now the greatest obstacle, other than funding, to developing the next generation of Alzheimer treatments.**

Where do the Trial Listings Come from?

The trial listings in the Alzheimer's Association TrialMatch come from publicly available sources, such as clinicaltrials.gov from the National Institutes of Health. In addition, direct outreach is being made to a wide variety of research facilities and trial sites across the country to include their Alzheimer's/dementia studies in the database. In order to be included in Alzheimer's Association TrialMatch, trial sites must submit proof of their approval by an institutional review board (IRB). This is a committee that approves, monitors and reviews research involving humans to protect the rights and welfare of the research subjects. Then the trials go through additional vetting by the Alzheimer's Association prior to being listed to ensure that listings only include credible trials and investigators.

How TrialMatch Works

Step 1 Access the TrialMatch tool at www.alz.org/trialmatch or call our toll-free number, 1-800-272-3900, 7 a.m.-7 p.m. CT, Monday–Friday.

Step 2 Complete a brief questionnaire about your diagnosis and current treatments, either online or over the phone, to create a profile for the potential clinical trial participant.

Step 3 Based on the specified eligibility criteria (i.e., diagnosis, treatment history, location), the Alzheimer’s Association will compare your unique profile to its comprehensive, up-to-date clinical trial database.

Step 4 With your permission, an Alzheimer’s Association Contact Center specialist will contact you to provide unbiased trial result options and trial site contact information. Specialists will not recommend any particular trial, but will help you identify trials that match your specific eligibility criteria.

In addition to Alzheimer’s Association TrialMatch, the following resources may be helpful in locating clinical trials:

Your doctor, who may know about local or specific research studies that may be right for you.

National Institute on Aging-supported Alzheimer’s Disease Centers or specialized memory or neurological clinics in your community that may be conducting trials.

How Clinical Trials Work

Clinical trials involve testing a new medication or therapy in a series of steps (or phases). During this sequence of testing, researchers gradually build evidence about whether a medication or therapy is effective and whether it has an acceptable “safety profile” (that is, whether the risks associated with its use are reasonable given its potential benefit).

New drugs must successfully complete a three-phase clinical trials process (Phase I, Phase II and Phase III) before being approved for use by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA). They also

must perform well enough in each phase to be allowed to progress on to the next one.

Phases of a Study

Preclinical studies in laboratories establish a scientific basis for believing a drug is reasonably safe and may be effective.

Phase I trials, the first stage of human testing, typically involves fewer than 100 volunteers. These studies look at the risks and side effects of a drug. Participants at this phase are healthy volunteers.

Phase II trials enroll up to a few hundred volunteers who have the condition the drug is designed to treat. These studies provide further information about safety and help to determine the best dosage of a drug. Phase II trials are generally too small to provide clear evidence about a treatment’s benefit.

Phase III trials enroll several hundred to thousands of volunteers, often at multiple study sites worldwide. They provide the chief evidence for safety and effectiveness that the FDA will consider in deciding whether to approve a drug.

Phase IV trials, also called post-marketing studies, are often required by the FDA after a drug is approved. During this phase, researchers continue to monitor the health of people taking the medication to gain further insight into its long-term safety and effectiveness.

Neurologist to Present Healthy Brain Aging and Alzheimer's Disease Program

The Committee for Advanced Learning is hosting a two hour program, "Update on Healthy Brain Aging and Alzheimer's Disease" for family and professional caregivers. Guest speaker is Michael S. Rafii, MD, PhD, a neurologist from California.

The program will be held Tuesday, June 14, 6:30-8:30 pm at the Peoria office, 606 W. Glen Avenue. The program is free and open to the public.

Dr. Rafii is Director of the Memory Disorders Clinic at UC San Diego Perlman Ambulatory Care Center in La Jolla, and Assistant Professor of Neurosciences at the University of California, San Diego. He is also Associate Medical Director of the Alzheimer's Disease Cooperative Study and Attending Neurologist at the Shiley-Marcos Alzheimer's Disease Research Center. He specializes in cognitive disorders, including dementias, such as Alzheimer's disease. He is board certified in neurology.

He received his MD and PhD from Brown University and conducted neurogenetics research at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Rafii went on to complete his neurology residency at the Johns Hopkins Hospital, where he was chief resident in Dementia and Cognitive Disorders at the University of California, San Diego.

Dr. Rafii has been an investigator on numerous clinical trials for Alzheimer's Disease. Additionally he has participated in the neuroimaging project for early stage diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease which was recently FDA approved.

Dr. Rafii will also be speaking at Grand Rounds at OSF SFMC the following day.

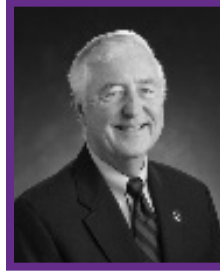

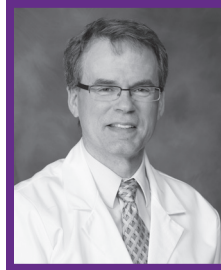


Teepa Snow is an occupational therapist currently working as a dementia care and dementia education specialist. She has an independent practice and

Margy Mazzola, Peoria

Margaret “Margy” Mazzola is a Chapter Champion in honor of her father, Joe, 83, who has Alzheimer’s disease, and her late mother, Molly, who was his devoted caregiver.

“My mother was a dynamic lady; very caring and devoted to my father,” says Margy. “She was 13 years younger than my dad and her death speaks volumes to the role of caregiving. It is an immense responsibility and my mom gave it her all.”

Joe was in a nursing home for only a couple months when Molly died. Diagnosed a decade ago, Molly took him to programs offered by the Alzheimer’s Association, and gradually assumed more and more responsibilities as the disease progressed. In 2009 she was featured in a Chapter video that is used to help educate other caregivers about educational programs, support groups and other community resources.

Unfortunately, she had a difficult time following her own advice, neglecting her own health and failing to take time for herself. Sadly, she died in January, 2010.

Margy and her two brothers formed the JWalkers team at last year’s Memory Walk

(name has been changed to Walk to End Alzheimer’s) in honor of their dad and raised \$2,000 for the Walk. She says it’s good to see people walking at the Peoria Riverfront and by participating she and her brothers feel loved and supported.

A lot of people need encouragement and to know they are not alone and it is what motivates Margy to walk for the cause. “I’ve lost my mother to this disease too,” states Margy. “But my mother was the true champion. She sought assistance and helped a lot of people along the way.”

She also points out that there can be peace and happiness with this disease. “We’re thankful for a lot,” she says. “My dad is really happy. He laughs a lot and is a funny guy. We take a lot of comfort in the fact that he is not grieving for my mom. She wouldn’t have wanted that.”

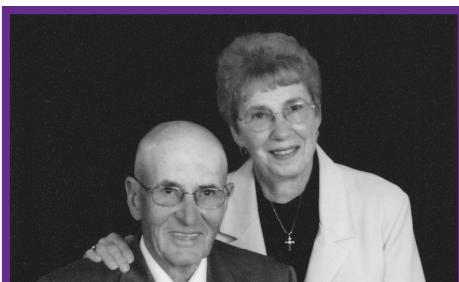
Bernie McFalls, Sterling

Bake sales, plant sales, garage sales, cookouts, and asking others for donations is the strategy Bernie McFalls employs when it comes to fundraising for the Alzheimer’s Association. Her efforts, and that of her 15-member team, Team Louie, raised over \$8,000 last year for the Rock River Memory Walk as they were awarded first place for top fundraising team.

“Yes,” she says, “Our garage sale and cookouts did real well.”

Bernie and her family and friends were walking in honor of her husband, Lewis, who was diagnosed with Alzheimer’s disease in September, 2002. His mother and sister had also suffered from the disease. Lewis died in July, 2010, just shy of his 83rd birthday.

After his diagnosis Bernie attended the Whiteside County Alzheimer's Support Group where she became educated about the disease and received support and encouragement from other support group members.

"I don't think until you have been around it, that you understand the magnitude of Alzheimer's disease," she explains. "After taking care of Louie and seeing what it is like, it bothers me that there is not a cure."

"Last year my son drove seven hours to be a part of the walk and the next day he drove seven hours home to go to work," says the mother of five. "We need to raise funds so we can have a lot more research. It is very important to me to do all I can to help find a cure."

Signe Oakley, Quincy

Signe Oakley has been married to Tony for 46 years.

"My family and I are involved in the Walk to End Alzheimer's because we know first hand the devastation of Alzheimer's disease, and we want to be part of the solution," she says.

Shortly after Tony's diagnosis in 2006, Signe sought the help of the Alzheimer's Association and attended family and

caregiver workshops, checked out materials from the Agency library, and attended the First Friday Lunch and Lecture series, all of which helped her and her family cope and provide for her husband's needs.

"The Senior Center Adult Day Care Services enabled me to continue working in a part time teaching position and helped allow my husband to remain in our home longer than if I hadn't had this service," she says. Tony now resides at the Illinois Veterans Home.

Signe and her family and friends once again have plans to participate in Quincy's Walk to End Alzheimer's event this fall, where she will also share her personal journey as part of the Walk program.

"Everyone in our extended family is very supportive. Not only our children and grandchildren, but also nieces and nephews as well as my sister-in-law," says Signe. "Join us in the Walk to End Alzheimer's. Please register too. Together we can do more to end Alzheimer's disease!"

Take for example life insurance policies. We purchase life insurance as a "safety net" to provide for our families and loved ones should something happen to us. At a certain point in our lives, we realize that we no longer need that safety net because we are in a different phase of our lives. At that time, it's simple to make the Alzheimer's Association the owner and/or beneficiary of the policy. If the Association is the owner of the policy, you may be able to receive a charitable deduction for the cash surrender value and reduce the amount of your taxable estate.

Retirement plans are another valuable way to support the Alzheimer's Association. Giving through retirement plans is simple and requires only a change of beneficiary. You may also find, after consulting with your financial advisor, that leaving other assets or property to family and using retirement plans to support the Association may have significant tax benefits to you and your family. Income taxes and possibly "death taxes" that may be due at death can be avoided.

Many states also allow so-called Payable On Death (POD) accounts that let you name a beneficiary of almost any financial account: savings, checking, certificates of deposit, credit union savings, etc. You simply indicate that your deposit will be "payable on death" to the Alzheimer's Association. That way, any remainder in savings or other financial account will be left to the Association for its use in fighting Alzheimer's disease.
