A Quick Look at Alzheimer's Disease Narrated by David Hyde Pierce, this DVD contains four "Pocket Films" on the following topics: What is Alzheimer's Disease, An Urgent Epidemic, The Race to the Cure, and A Message for Patients and their Families.

Accepting the Challenge: Providing the best care for people with dementia. Four modules designed to help professional caregivers provide the best possible care for people with dementia. The four modules include: What is Dementia?, Physical Approach, Offering Assistance and Meaningful Days.

Alzheimer's Disease: Inside Looking Out Several persons with early stage Alzheimer's talk openly about the impact of the disease on their lives, about their feelings and about how they are coping.

Away From Her (110 minutes) A fictional movie about a married couple dealing with the effects of memory loss and the inevitable transition from lovers to strangers.

Behavior Management Training for Dementia Care Learn how to manage dementia-caused behaviors effectively using an easy three-step model. This interactive DVD can be used individually or in a group setting, and will provide caregivers with the management skills needed for high quality care whether in a facility or at home.

Dementia and People with Intellectual Disabilities: What Can We Do? (23 minutes) Explores the unique challenges of two disabilities.

Dementia with Dignity Based on Barbara Shermann's world acclaimed book of the same name. It is packed with useful advice and information. It takes place entirely on location at residential and day care facilities within Australia.

Don't Forget About Me (16) This DVD was produced by students in the Shenedehowa High School Film/Video Art Class in Clifton Park, NY and attempts to teach children about Alzheimer's disease.

Enlightened Alzheimer's Caregiving: Overview of Alzheimer's Disease This DVD provides an overview of dementia, including the most common type, Alzheimer's disease, its cognitive changes and how it affects behavior and function. It also covers the general stages and its progression.

Enlightened Alzheimer's Caregiving: Managing the Difficulties of Mealtime This DVD on mealtime and nutrition in Alzheimer's disease looks at some of the most common problems, their causes, and suggestions and tips for how to overcome them.

Family (44 minutes) A video sponsored by the makers of Namenda, it is a nostalgic stroll through the milestones of family life that will bring smiles to people with memory loss and their caregivers.

Learning to Speak Alzheimer's: An Intro to Habilitation Applying the basic concepts of habilitation (which is simply caregiving that embraces the remaining abilities of the person with dementia, the video shows how to create a suitable environment in which the person can lead a quality life through proactive adjustments. The approach will enhance the physical, psycho-social, and sensory world of the person with dementia.

The Family Guide to Alzheimer's Disease. Will help you understand the disease and its effects. Gives tips on how to care for your loved one and yourself.

The Forgetting: A Portrait of Alzheimer's (90 minutes) This documentary weaves together the intense real-world experiences of Alzheimer's patients and caregivers, the history and biology of Alzheimer's and the ongoing struggle to end the disease. Includes ½ hour follow up program with experts providing practical advice on coping with Alzheimer's disease.

Iris (91 minutes) Based on a true story, Iris first became known as a brilliant young scholar at Oxford who boundless spirit dazzled those around her. Even in later life, as age and illness robbed Iris of her remarkable gifts, nothing could diminish her immense influence or weaken the bond with her devoted husband.

Talk Back, Move Forward: 100 Years of Alzheimer's What is Alzheimer's? What is it really? Do people understand it? How have we gone wrong with care in the past? How do we imagine the experience of this disease can be made better? This DVD forms a collage of our views of and experiences with the disease, our critique of public attitudes and systems of care, and our visions for how to make things better.
