Alzheimer's from the Inside Out (2007) by Robert Taylor. Thoughtful and self-reflective, this collection of illuminating essays offers a rare glimpse into the often incomprehensible world of individuals living with Alzheimer's disease. Diagnosed at age 58, psychologist Richard Taylor shares his account of his slow transformation and deterioration, and of the growing divide between his reality and the reality of others.

I Choose to Continue by Bobbie Glaze Custer. Descriptive life story of a woman including her time as a caregiver for her husband with AD.

Lessons for our Lifetime (2001) by Atria Senior Living. A compilation of stories shared by the residents of Atria Retirement and Assisted Living. They share their experiences about life before TVs, telephones and other modern conveniences; they share about world wars and the Great Depression.

Living in the Labyrinth (1993) by Diane Friel McGowin. Written by a person with Alzheimer's, this book gives a glimpse into the world of AD and the experience of living with dementia.

Losing My Mind: An intimate look at life with Alzheimer's (2002) by Thomas DeBaggio. An autobiography that vividly articulates the profound shock and despair of one person in the early stages of Alzheimer's disease.

My Journey Into Alzheimer's Disease (1989) by Robert Davis. This book is a first person account of a pastor of one of Miami, Florida's largest churches who began to notice subtle changes in his personality and memory. It offers inspiration to those affected by the disease.

Partial View: An Alzheimer's Journey (1998) by Cary Smith Henderson. Using photos and journal entries, a person with AD records his experience.

Show Me the Way To Go Home (1996) By Larry Rose. Absorbing first-person account of a journey through AD.

Speaking Our Minds (1999) by Lisa Snyder, L.C.S.W. Personal reflections from individuals with Alzheimer's. They discuss receiving the diagnosis, changes in family and social relationships, spirituality and personal identity.

A View From Within (2001) by Thaddeus M. Raushi, Ph.D. Reflects the author's inner thoughts & feelings about living a high quality life with a low quality disease called Alzheimer's.

Will I Be Next ? (1996) by Louis Bristow. Both a biography of a remarkable woman and a comprehensive review of information helpful to those struggling to care for someone with Alzheimer's disease.
