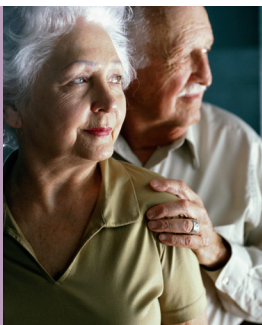
2010 Annual Report

History of Alzheimer's Association Long Island...



Founded in May of 1983, we are the local Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association, which is headquartered in Chicago, Illinois. Our Chapter is part of a 74 Chapter Network affiliated with the National Alzheimer's Association. Through this Chapter Network, the Association operates over 300 Point of Service offices across the United States. We are a non-profit, charitable tax-exempt organization dedicated to family service, education and research. The Long Island Chapter currently advocates for over 55,000 individuals who have been diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease, as well as their families and/or caregivers.

The Chapter has opened The Neuwirth Family Care Center, expanding our Care & Consultation services. We have also been approved by the Institutional Review Board for the LIJ/North Shore Health Systems to provide clinical evaluations through a research project headed by The Litwin-Zucker Center for Memory Disorders and Alzheimer's Disease. We also maintain a Nassau County satellite office at the Zucker-Hillside Pavilion.

In addition, the Chapter has now developed, in collaboration with St. Joseph's College, an Alzheimer's Disease specific curriculum for healthcare professionals. This curriculum was launched at the college on January 18th, 2006 and is currently being taught offsite at facilities, as well as on campus.

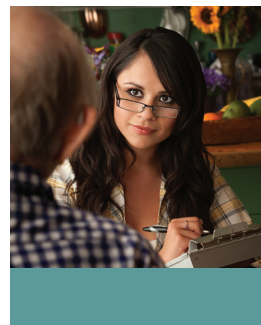

Alzheimer's Association Long Island provides a broad range of programs and services for people with the disease, families, care partners, residential care professionals and professional health care providers. Highlights of our programs include the following:

Care & Consultation – provided through the Neuwirth Family Care Center, our Care Consultant meets with families to develop a long-term care plan, connecting families to available resources.

24 Hour Helpline - a toll-free service, available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, to families, health care professionals, and the general public across the country.

Medic Alert+Safe Return – a nationwide identification program to assist in the safe and timely return of individuals who have wandered from home, as well as other safety information services, such as home safety and driving.

Education – more than 100,000 hours of education, service, and support programs including over 2500 hours of programs designed for individuals with dementia.

Support Groups – located in Nassau & Suffolk Counties providing guidance and support for family caregivers.
