Who should attend?

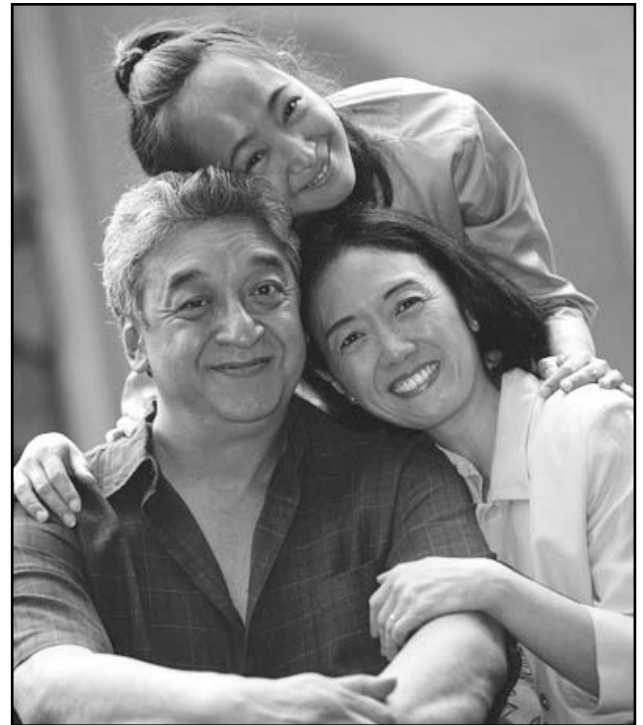
This conference is intended for individuals with young-onset dementia and their care partners, family members and anyone else interested in learning more about this topic.
