Introduction

Videos are a dynamic, user-friendly means of sharing information on Alzheimer's disease. Observers hear people's stories firsthand and have the opportunity to view clinical footage or practical information that can help clarify aspects of the disease and caregiving.

The Benjamin B. Green-Field National Library staff at the Alzheimer's Association national office selected videos for inclusion in *Alzheimer Videos: An Annotated Guide, 2003* based on their usefulness and applicability for a wide variety of audiences. The guide provides information on 417 videos dealing with Alzheimer's disease, related disorders, and the care of people with dementing conditions. Most of the videos listed were produced since 1996. A small number of earlier titles are included because they contain unique content.

Each entry contains a summary of the content along with publisher, distributor, and production information. The guide is arranged alphabetically by title and includes subject, audience, and running-length indexes as well as contact information for ordering videos directly from the distributor.

Videos that are part of the collection of the Green-Field Library are so identified. Association chapters may borrow items directly from the library. Members of the general public should ask their local public library to obtain the video through interlibrary loan.
