Welcoming Series for People with Early-Stage Alzheimer's

The Welcoming Series is an educational and supportive series that meets over several months and is designed specifically for individuals in the early stages of Alzheimer's disease or a related dementia, and those who support them.

Each session, participants meet together to receive information about important topics related to living with memory loss, and then separate into two groups for discussion, allowing those living with memory loss to come together, and their care partners to meet separately.

- Opportunities to share experiences and ask questions
- Support, brain-storming, and planning resources
- A chance to form friendships and talk about living with dementia
