A eight-week education and discussion program that helps answer the questions, “How can I live well with this diagnosis?” and “What do I need to consider to make the most of today while planning for the future?”

Who is eligible to attend? People with a diagnosis of either mild cognitive impairment (MCI) or any type of dementia in the early stage who are interested in and able to actively discuss the topics introduced. A care partner, spouse, family member, or close friend is also encouraged to attend.

What is the application process? An in-person interview is required prior to attending.
