Abuse and the Dementia Patient (Univ of Md School of Med). (Length: 22 mins, Date: 2001) **Topics:** Behaviors

Care of individuals with dementia can present a significant challenge due to difficult behaviors exhibited. Nursing staff of the Johns Hopkins Bayview Geriatric Center provides some easy-to-implement strategies to prevent frustration and potential abuse situations from developing.

Accepting the Challenge: Providing the best care for people with dementia. (DVD). (Length: 190 mins, Date: 2003) **Topics:** Caregiving

Designed to help caregivers and health care professionals provide the best possible care for people with dementia. Through interactive classroom lecture and demonstration to on-site interactions with Alzheimer's patients, viewers will be challenged to open their minds and their hearts to a new way of thinking, learning, and caregiving.

Aging with Grace (See also Caregiving with Grace) www.northwestmedia.com. (Length: 22 mins, Date: 1999) **Topics:** Aging

An uplifting and spirited conversation among articulate seniors on the impact of aging and their sense of who they are. The bottom line: you need never stop growing and learning as you age, despite the limitations and losses that accompany the process. An eye-opening video for older people and caregivers alike, sure to erase any doubt that you CAN grow old gracefully.

Activity Programming for Dementia by Mary Lucero Set of 4 Videos. (Length: Unkn mins, Date: 1999) **Topics:** Activities, Training

Four videos made of a training that Mary Lucero provided at Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Virginia Beach.

Alone But Not Forgotten (with accompanying manual). (Length: 48 mins, Date: 2000) **Topics:** Caregiving

The video focuses on the issue of providing care to individuals with Alzheimer's disease who live alone. One story portrays an African-American woman who gets help from her sister who lives nearby and community agencies. The other story shows a Caucasian woman who has no family but receives care from community programs. The video raises safety, health, transport, and relationship issues.

Alzheimer's Association Video. (Length: 15 mins, Date: 1995) **Topics:** Overview
Produced by the Hampton Roads Chapter, this is a general overview of Alzheimer's disease and how it affects the brain. It includes interviews with several caregivers and a high school student about their involvement with Alzheimer's disease.

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Alzheimer's Disease and Intellectual Disabilities (Down's Syndrome) Tool Kit.

(Length: 23 mins, Date: 2002) **Topics:** Down Syndrome, Related Disorders
Tool kit includes a 23 minute video (Dementia & People with Intellectual Disabilities: What Can We Do?); a 2-set CD Rom kit providing a course designed by the University at Albany's School of Social Welfare; and written materials on Alzheimer's and Down's Syndrome.

Alzheimer's Disease at Time of Diagnosis. (Length: 30 mins, Date: 1996) **Topics:** Caregiving, Diagnosis

Time Life Medical series video on medical issues, decision making, and tips for caregiving. Doesn't include information on latest medications (when it was produced Cognex/Tacrine was the only medication on the market).

Alzheimer's Disease Do's & Don'ts. (Length: 25 mins, Date: 2000) **Topics:** Caregivers, Support Groups

Interviews with members of a support group facilitated by Peter Rabins, this video discusses do's and don't for family caregivers. Part of a 2-part video series entitled Interacting with Alzheimer Patients: Tips for Families and Friends (other part is titled Recognizing & Preventing Caregiver Burnout).

Alzheimer's Disease: Inside Looking Out. (Length: 18 mins, Date: 1995) **Topics:** Early Stage

A videotape featuring persons in the early stages of AD sharing their experiences, and the need for them to remain a respected participant in the decisions that affect their lives, from disclosure of diagnosis to planning for end of life choices. Video is followed by a tag video for those unfamiliar with the help available from the Alzheimer's Association.

Alzheimer's Disease: Interviewing & Assessment Techniques for Social Workers.

(Length: 30 mins, Date: 1990) **Topics:** Training, Diagnosis, Alzheimer's Disease
Produced by the Alzheimer's Disease Research Center at Duke University Medical Center. For complete kit of 4 videos, see video training kits below.

Alzheimer's Disease: Let's Talk About It. (Length: 15 mins, Date: 1996) **Topics:** Overview

Overview of Alzheimer's disease produced by Glaxo Wellcome Pharmaceutical Company. Researchers, caregivers, and people with Alzheimer's disease share their perspectives and demonstrate that the disease affects a wide range of individuals.

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Alzheimer's Disease: Natural Feeding Techniques. (Length: 14 mins, Date: 1993)

Topics: Feeding

Uses three case studies to show techniques for encouraging feeding and avoiding use of feeding tubes for individuals with dementia. The program suggests making breakfast and lunch the biggest meals of the day, serving a variety of food, using more staff to help out at mealtimes, and offering cues for chewing and swallowing. Produced by the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Alzheimer's Disease: Pieces of the Puzzle. This tape has Parts 1 through 5.. (Length: 119 mins, Date: 1997) **Topics:** Training, Overview

Training program in five parts of both professional and family caregivers, presenting an overview of how memory and other brain functions work, how Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia are diagnosed, and how AD affects the brain and thus influences behavior and functioning. Videos were developed to correspond with 16-hour training outlined in accompanying training manual. Dramatizations show how experienced caregivers cope with communication problems, and experts demonstrate how to handle difficult behaviors using scenes from real life. A section on recreation explains how to choose and implement appropriate activities. The program also addresses how to provide personal care to people with AD.

Alzheimer's Disease: Pieces of the Puzzle: Part 1 of 5 Introduction. (Length: 35 mins, Date: 1997) **Topics:** Overview, Alzheimer's Disease

For both professionals and caregivers. Criteria for diagnosing dementia, aspects of brain functioning and memory, and effects of Alzheimer's disease on brain, behavior and functioning. Outlined in accompanying training manual

Alzheimer's Disease: Pieces of the Puzzle: Part 2 of 5 A Practical Approach to Communication. (Length: 23 mins, Date: 1997) **Topics:** Communication, Training
For both professionals and caregivers. Poignant and fast-paced dramatization in which 5 aides discuss and portray effective communication techniques. Training outlined in accompanying training manual

Alzheimer's Disease: Pieces of the Puzzle: Part 3 of 5 A Practical Approach to Activities of Daily Living. (Length: 23 mins, Date: 1997) **Topics:** Training, ADLs
For both professionals and caregivers. Effective approaches to assisting with personal care activities of daily living. Combines footage of actual situations with caregiver interviews, narration, and dramatizations. Training outlined in accompanying training manual

Alzheimer's Disease: Pieces of the Puzzle: Part 4 of 5 A Practical Approach to Problem Behaviors. (Length: 23 mins, Date: 1997) **Topics:** Caregivers, Behaviors
For both professionals and caregivers. Explores common causes of problem behaviors, guidelines for coping with behaviors, and problem-solving approaches. Training outlined in accompanying training manual

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Alzheimer's Disease: Pieces of the Puzzle: Part 5 of 5 A Practical Approach to Recreational Activities. (Length: 23 mins, Date: 1997) **Topics:** Activities, Training
For both professionals and caregivers. Upbeat program centered on footage of caregivers and person with dementia taking part in a variety of recreational activities. Discusses benefits of recreation, how to select successful activities, and how to introduce activities effectively. Training outlined in accompanying training manual

Alzheimer's Disease: What Every African-American Needs to Know. (Length: 30 mins, Date: 2002) **Topics:** African-American
Produced by the Mayo Clinic Jacksonville in Florida as a way of promoting their local outreach efforts to screen African-American individuals, this video provides a good overview of the impact of Alzheimer's disease on African-American families, and the need for assessment and use of community support services.

Alzheimer's Disease: What Everyone Should Know. (Length: 24 mins, Date: 2000) **Topics:** Overview
Produced by Novartis Pharmaceuticals as part of their caregivers kit, this video features TV personality Linda Dano and offers an overview of Alzheimer's disease. The video concludes by providing information on Novartis' drug Exelon.

Alzheimer's Special: Driving & Dementia Don't Mix. (Length: 30 mins, Date: 1995) **Topics:** Driving
A physician, an occupational therapist, and a representative from the Missouri Department of Motor Vehicles discuss driving and dementia. Three people talk about problems they've experienced when people with dementia continue to drive. Segments of the video pertain specifically to the state of Missouri. Produced by the St. Louis, Missouri chapter of the Alzheimer's Association.

Alzheimer's: My Mom, Our Journey. (Length: 45 mins, Date: 2002) **Topics:** Early Onset, Stories
This is the story of Gloria Jean Meisner and her battle with early onset Alzheimer's disease. Shown through the eyes of Gloria and her three children, this is an intimate documentary of one family's courageous battle with an unstoppable disease that is typically considered to be reserved for the elderly. Shot over the course of 18 months, and told in Gloria's own words, this is an intimate story of one family's experiences with this devastating disease.

Alzheimer's: A Multicultural perspective. (Length: 34 mins, Date: 1993) **Topics:** Multi-Cultural
Terra Nova. Documents Chinese, Japanese, Latino & Vietnamese families caring for elders with AD, facing obstacles including language barriers, non-support from families, inaccurate AD information and cultural norms mitigating against long term care placement. Possible solutions are discussed.

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Assisting AD Families the Hospital Setting. (Length: 10 mins, Date: 1990) **Topics:** Family, Facilities, Training

Tape 4 of the 4-video set "Working with AD Patients and their Families" (see full set description below) developed by Elisabeth Hinman-Smith, MSW and Lisa Gwyther, MSW at Duke University Medical Center.

Balancing Act: Your Fall Prevention Program (with manual). (Length: 24 mins, Date: 2000) **Topics:** Falls, Training

This staff-training video teaches factors and conditions that increase the risk of a resident fall, the importance of assessing each resident for risk of falling, interventions relating to environmental, medical and behavioral causes of falls, how to respond after a resident falls, and the importance of good communication and problem-solving as a team effort. Accompanied by short presenter's guide.

Bathing Without a Battle. (Length: 60 mins, Date: 2003) **Topics:** Bathing, Training
Video and interactive CD-Rom that covers topics including simple practical approaches to making showering and bathing more comfortable, bathing equipment and supplies, facility bathing policies, and federal nursing home regulations dealing with bathing. Separate tracks are available for nurses, nursing assistants, nursing home administrators, surveyors, ombudsperson, and home caregivers.

Best Friends. (Length: 14 mins, Date: 1993) **Topics:** Respite, Volunteers

This video demonstrates that individual care can significantly improve the quality of life for persons with Alzheimer's and can prevent difficult-to-manage behaviors. It profiles a model volunteer program that provides care for persons with Alzheimer's disease in a day care center. Working one-on-one, the volunteers provide both respite for the caregiver and safe, creative companionship for the person with dementia.

Bon Appetit: How to Create Meaningful Mealtimes in Long Term Care. Part 1 of 2. (Length: 22 mins, Date: 2001) **Topics:** Feeding

A two-part video (20 min & 22 min) series presenting a comprehensive mealtime program that focuses on principles of resident autonomy and person-centered care. Special attention is devoted to identifying the needs of people with dementia. The program covers the effects of dementia on communications, behavior and eating; creating dining experiences with less distraction; and how to prepare and serve food in a way that enables the resident to eat as independently as possible.

Bon Appetit: How to Create Meaningful Mealtimes in Long Term Care. Part 2 of 2. (Length: 20 mins, Date: 2001) **Topics:** Feeding

See description above for Part 1.

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Brush Those Teeth & Dentures: Mouth Care for the Dependent Elderly. (Length: 22 mins, Date: 2001) **Topics:** Oral Care

This program was developed for all caregivers, including nursing assistants, home health aides, and family members. Demonstrations show how to brush another person's teeth and how to clean dentures.

Can't Afford to Grow Old (PBS WNET NY). (Length: 25 mins, Date: 1989) **Topics:** Financial

A look at the aging population in America and how increasingly difficult it is becoming to keep your loved one at home without being financially destitute. Hosted by Walter Cronkite. Includes Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, and other infirmities.

Caregiver Issues: Planning the Care of Aging Loved Ones. (Length: 20 mins, Date: 1998) **Topics:** Caregiving, Family

Doug Manning discusses family conflict and care for the caregiver on this video. He discusses the need for a family meeting to plan care, caregiver bill of rights, dealing with family conflict and uneven distribution of responsibility, caregiver burnout, and the need for caregivers to accept support and respite.

Caregiver Series (The): All five parts on this one tape. (Length: 90 mins, Date: 1990) **Topics:** Caregiving

Set of 5 videos developed by the National Alzheimer's Association to address caregiving issues: 2 videos with the complete set; a few videos with just one segment.

Caregiver Series (The): Part 1 of 5 Meeting Daily Challenges. (Length: 15 mins, Date: 1990) **Topics:** Caregiving, ADLs

Family caregivers discuss techniques for assisting with activities of daily living such as eating, bathing, dressing.

Caregiver Series (The): Part 2 of 5 Communicating. (Length: 19.5 mins, Date: 1990) **Topics:** Communication

Overview of suggestions for effective communication with an individual with dementia. Provides practical examples of family caregivers as they interact with their loved one. Discusses the importance of maintaining the person's dignity and the importance of using alternative forms of communication such as touching, music, etc. as the person's verbal skills diminish.

Caregiver Series (The): Part 3 of 5 Safety First. (Length: 14.1 mins, Date: 1990) **Topics:** Caregiving, Safety

This video makes safety a top priority for Alzheimer's caregiving. It presents ways in which family members and other caregivers can prepare for an emergency involving the person with dementia. It also suggests ideas for making the home accident proof and preventing emergencies.

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Caregiver Series (The): Part 4 of 5 Managing Difficult Behavior. (Length: 21.5 mins, Date: 1990) **Topics:** Behaviors, Caregiving

This video presents some of the common feelings Alzheimer's patients experience, and the behavioral problems that often result from such feelings. There are suggestions for caregivers relating to the patient's feelings and to adapting the environment in order to manage these symptoms.

Caregiver Series (The): Part 5 of 5 Caring for the Caregiver. (Length: 20.2 mins, Date: 1990) **Topics:** Caregiving, Family

Caregivers discuss learning how to take care of themselves, understanding how relationships will change, and coping with the stress and sadness of the disease's progression. This video presents an overview of how caregivers can best take care of themselves while providing individuals with dementia the best possible care.

Caregiving with Grace (see also Aging with Grace). (Length: 36 mins, Date: 1987) **Topics:** Caregiving, End Stage

Part of an award-winning documentary, this video focuses on the caregiver's role in taking care of Grace Kirkland who had Alzheimer's disease and eventually died in 1990 at the age of 79. In this video, Grace is no longer able to speak, and needs assistance with activities of daily living.

Caring for the Caring. (Length: 30 mins, Date: 2005) **Topics:** Caregiver

Moving Documentary presents the ongoing challenges of two women who give loving care to their seriously ill husbands suffering from Parkinson's and Alzheimer's disease. Reveals the emotional and physical toll on these "silent heroines."

Challenges in Caregiving:. (Length: 35 mins, Date: 1993) **Topics:** Caregiving, Stages
Insights of the progression of Alzheimer's disease and the impact on caregivers.

Child's View of Grief, A. (Length: 10 mins, Date: 1990) **Topics:** Grief/Grieving, Children

Video designed to give adults a view of how children cope with grief: dimensions of childhood grief, the role of caring adults, guidelines for involving children in the funeral, adolescent mourning. Part of the "Picking Up the Pieces" series which deals with grief but is not specific to Alzheimer's disease; an accompanying booklet is also available in the library.

Choice and Challenge: Caring for Aggressive Older Adults Across Levels of Care with manual. (Length: 23 mins, Date: 1998) **Topics:** Training, Anger

A training video with accompanying written materials designed by the American Psychiatric Nurses Association. The video was designed for nurses, nursing assistants, and other care providers who work with behaviorally impaired and aggressive older adults.

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CNA's and Their Role in Skilled Nursing Facilities. (Length: Unkn mins, Date: 1998)

Topics: Training, Facility Care

Communicating the Impact of Alzheimer's Disease to Patients & Caregivers.

(Length: 20 mins, Date: 1999) **Topics:** Healthcare Professional

Produced by the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and underwritten by Eisai-Pfizer, this video was part of a 1 credit CME program for physicians working with families and patients who've just been diagnosed with Alzheimer's.

Communicating with the Alzheimer's-Type Population: The Validation Method.

(Length: 19 mins, Date: 1988) **Topics:** Communication, Validation

Naomi Feil demonstrates communication techniques in 2 role plays - Marge, the Blamer, and Muriel, the Wanderer. Each scenario demonstrates inappropriate and appropriate ways to interact with an elderly individual with dementia who is demonstrating "challenging" behaviors.

Compassionate Touch: Benefits and Effects in Long Term Care Terra Nova.

(Length: 23 mins, Date: 1995) **Topics:** Therapeutic Activities, Training

A certified massage therapist shows the benefits of focused touch and gentle massage in caring for and relating to those who have Alzheimer's disease. The therapist works in a nursing home and an adult day care center, and administrators from both facilities offer their views and explain how residents benefit.

Complaints of a Dutiful Daughter. (Length: 44 mins, Date: 1994) **Topics:** Caregiving, Parents

Chronicles the various stages of a mother's AD and the evolution of a daughter's response to the illness. Neither depressing nor medical, it is much more than a story about AD and family caregiving. It is ultimately a life-affirming exploration of family relations, aging and change, the meaning of memory, and love.

Coping with the Incurable. (Length: 14 mins, Date: 1984) **Topics:** Caregiving, Stages

First a lady whose husband develops AD, losing things, gets lost. After many MDs, a diagnosis of AD -- almost a relief to have a name for it. Then Jim 44, quiet, nobody noticed until he lost his job. More as AD progresses. Discussion of AD by an MD. Avoid guilt, get into a Support Group, when things get bad you need the group and probably a home at some point. We have a long way to go in understanding AD and helping caregivers.

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Day in the Life of Nancy Moore, A (Terra Nova). (Length: 28 mins, Date: 1990)

Topics: Training, Facility Care

This video was developed at Duke University specifically for nursing assistants who care for residents with dementia. The video follows nursing assistant, Nancy Moore through a typical day as she cares for residents in a calm, caring manner. Information on care issues is also presented in the video from the perspective of a physician, social worker, and family caregiver.

Dealing with Alzheimer's Disease: Common Sense Approach to Communication.

(Length: 21 mins, Date: 1990) **Topics:** Caregiving, Communication

Designed to help caregivers understand and deal with the most common behavioral changes and language deficits affecting persons with Alzheimer's disease. (Ramsey Foundation)

Dealing with Alzheimer's: Facing Difficult Decisions. (Length: 23 mins, Date: 1992)

Topics: Caregiving, Late Stage, Placement Decisions

Three families discuss the difficult decision in determining home care versus nursing home placement, including treatments, hospitalization, CPR, feeding issues and comfort measures.

Dealing with Physical Aggression in Caregiving: Non-Physical & Physical

Interventions Part 1 of 3. (Length: 21 mins, Date: 1992) **Topics:** Training, Behaviors

This 3-video training package developed by Carly Hellen and Peter Sternberg teaches staff the procedures to avoid, and if necessary, contain, aggressive behaviors while still preserving the dignity of the resident. The series teaches both non-physical and physical interventions, along with the concept of "a unified staff response system" which is designed to bring staff support to deal safely with harmful situations. Each video covers specific threatening situations with both non-physical and physical interventions discussed and demonstrated.

Dealing with Physical Aggression in Caregiving: Non-Physical & Physical

Interventions Part 2 of 3. (Length: 25 mins, Date: 1992) **Topics:** Caregiving, Behaviors

Carly Hellen and Peter Sternberg teach staff the procedures to avoid, and if necessary, contain, aggressive behaviors while still preserving the dignity of the resident. Part 2 of 3

Dealing with Physical Aggression in Caregiving: Non-Physical & Physical

Interventions Part 3 of 3. (Length: 22 mins, Date: 1992) **Topics:** Training, Behaviors

Carly Hellen and Peter Sternberg teach staff the procedures to avoid, and if necessary, contain, aggressive behaviors while still preserving the dignity of the resident. Part 3 of 3

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Dealing with Sexually Inappropriate Behavior: 2 Segments, Segment 1 (18 mins) Masturbation & Sexually Provocative Behavior Segment 2 (24 mins) Physical Touching and Disrobing. (Length: 42 mins, Date: 1996) **Topics:** Training, Sexuality, Behaviors

Sexually inappropriate or provocative behavior may trigger negative reactions and interfere with a staff's ability to manage these behaviors. Segment 1: Clinical vignettes illustrate how nursing home staff can develop effective ways of handling residents' inappropriate sexual behavior. Segment 2: Shows ways to bring inappropriate sexual conduct under control while maintaining a healthy environment; it explains why such behavior occurs and suggests ways to respond.

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Dealing With Sexually Inappropriate Behavior: Segment 1 Masturbation And Sexually Provocative Behavior. (Length: 18 mins, Date: 1996) **Topics:** Training, Sexuality, Behaviors

Clinical vignettes illustrate how nursing home staff can develop effective ways of handling residents' inappropriate sexual behavior. VideoPress Univ of Maryland School of Medicine

Dealing With Sexually Inappropriate Behavior: Segment 2 Physical Touching And Disrobing. (Length: 24 mins, Date: 1996) **Topics:** Training, Sexuality, Behaviors

Shows ways to bring inappropriate sexual conduct under control while maintaining a healthy environment; it explains why such behavior occurs and suggests ways to respond. VideoPress Univ of Maryland School of Medicine

Defining Treatment Success: Real-Life Experiences in Managing Alzheimer's Disease (Johns Hopkins School of Medicine). (Length: 30 mins, Date: 2000) **Topics:** Training, Healthcare Professional, Treatment

CME (2 hours CE credit) Presents four real-life case studies. How each patient's physician diagnosed and treated AD and the treatment results. Self study program is flexible; the video can be watched first and the monograph read or vice-versa.

Dementia & People with Intellectual Disabilities. (Length: 23 mins, Date: 2002)

Topics: Training, Down Syndrome, Related Disorders

Training video for professionals on how to care for individuals with Down's Syndrome who develop dementia. The video provides an overview of dementia, and guidelines for communication and care. The video is also included in the Alzheimer's Disease and Intellectual Disabilities Tool Kit.

Dementia and Driving: Issues and Answers. (Length: 12 mins, Date: 1999) **Topics:** Driving

Dr. Jean Root, Medical Director, Senior Health Center, Police Officer David Gervira and Judy Van Hoef, Exec Dir Alzheimer's Assoc, Oklahoma. Taking away the auto is very touchy. Safety is the key issue. With erosion of judgement and trouble with visual and spatial coordination the patient must stop driving. Several methods are discussed.

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Dementia in Primary Care. (Length: 45 mins, Date: 1999) **Topics:** Healthcare Professional, Diagnosis, Treatment

Developed by Alzheimer's Disease International and Kings College London, this video was created to help general practitioners assess, diagnose, and work with individuals with dementia. Detailed guidance on administering the abbreviated mental test score, assessing activities of daily living, dealing with multiple diagnoses (i.e. for Parkinson's and depression), and determining caregiver support needs.

Designing the Physical Environment for Persons with Dementia with a manual.

(Length: 22 mins, Date: 1987) **Topics:** Design, Facility

Discusses 11 factors to consider in designing a facility to accommodate individuals with mid-stage Alzheimer's or other dementias. Focuses on one specific facility – Wesley Hall in Michigan – and their attempts to create a physical environment that offers support and helps to compensate for memory and behavior deficits.

Do You Remember Love (Dave Bell Productions). (Length: 95 mins, Date: 1985)

Topics: Early Onset, Stories

A CBS made-for-TV dramatic special starring Joanne Woodward as Barbara Wyatt-Hollis, a 50 year old college professor and poet who is stricken with AD at the height of her career.

Dress Him While He Walks; Management in Caring for Residents with Alzheimer's.

(Length: 19 mins, Date: 1993) **Topics:** Caregiving, Behaviors

Provides suggestions for dealing with behaviors such as restlessness/agitation, pacing, wandering, and aggressive behaviors. Discusses the importance of trying to identify the cause of the behavior problem and techniques for dealing with the behaviors. Excellent for respite care workers and nursing staff.

Early onset memory loss: a conversation with Letty Tennis. (Length: 22 mins, Date: 1992) **Topics:** Personal, Early Onset, Autobiography

Ms. Tennis courageously and honestly presents her reactions to her progressive memory loss. (Duke University)

Elder Abuse: The Real Definition Compilation of Parts 1, 2 and 3 of 3 parts..
