Divided into modules, this is a training program designed to help professional caregivers better understand the behaviors and symptoms of people with dementia. **3 hrs.**

Activity Professionals Consultant: Creative Solutions to Dementia Programming.

Part 1 deals with making cognitive assessments for program planning. **1 hr. 17 min.**

Part 2 builds on program recommendations from Pt. 1. Included is end-stage dementia programming and information on transitioning between mid-stage and end-stage skill levels. **1 hr. 15 min**

Almost Home DVD (2006)

This PBS documentary, shot on location in a nursing home, tells real stories of aging. This is also the story of a nursing home director committed to positive changes in a care facility. This video was filmed at St. John's on the Lake in Milwaukee.

Alone But Not Forgotten

This video gives advice for caregivers on safety, health, transportation and relationships and discusses the unique problems facing those with Alzheimer's who live alone. **48 min.**

Alzheimer's: A Multi-Cultural Perspective (1993)

This documentary focuses on the actual experience of four families as they care for an elder with Alzheimer's. Includes four ethnic minority groups. **34 min.**

Alzheimer's: A True Story (1999)

A starkly realistic portrayal of the evolution of Alzheimer's disease in a professor and pianist who was diagnosed at age 51. The film begins with early symptoms and ends with his death. His dedicated wife describes the strains of caregiving. **75 min.**

Alzheimer's: Making Connections

A training program for those working in activity therapy situations for those with Alzheimer's disease and other dementia. Actual dementia care programs in adult day care, group home and nursing home settings are featured. **1 hr. 48 min.**

Alzheimer's: My Mom, Our Journey (2004)

One family's courageous battle against Early Onset Alzheimer's. Filmed over 18 months, the producer/director chronicles her mother's journey, including interviews with her mom to capture the essence of what she was experiencing. **46 min.**

Christine and Paul: A Journey with Alzheimer's Disease DVD (2006)

Christine, a 46-year-old mother of three with a demanding career, was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease shortly after her divorce from an abusive husband. Despite her diagnosis, she married again three years later. Her new husband, Paul, became her support as her disease progressed. Ten years after diagnosis, Christine remained active as a writer and lecturer recounting her own experience. **50 min.**

Clinical Profiles in Alzheimer's Disease: Mild, Moderate and Severe (1998)

A discussion of diagnostic procedures in evaluating Alzheimer's disease. MMSE testing is included. **25 min.**

The Dollmaker

This video shows a female caretaker who gives 24-hour care to her spouse suffering from Alzheimer's disease, emphasizing the need for caregivers to take care of themselves. Workshop guide is available for use with this video.

Don't Forget About Me (Children and Alzheimers) (2002) DVD

This video for school-age children, helps them learn about Alzheimer's disease while offering support and encouragement. **15 min.**

Dress Him While He Walks: Behavior Management in Caring for Residents with Alzheimer's (1996)

Workers in a long-term care unit specializing in Alzheimer's disease offer suggestions for handling wandering, delusions and hallucinations as well as tips for communicating with residents. Demonstrations are included. Behavior management rather than behavior modification is stressed. **20 min.**

Even These May Forget: A Pastoral Care Challenge (1992)

A training video to help clergy understand Alzheimer's disease and how to minister to families affected by it. **18 min.**

Facing Alzheimer's: An African-American Perspective (2002) VHS and DVD

This video talks about how families cope with Alzheimer's, taking into account cultural attitudes common among African-Americans and reassures caregivers that they are not alone. **21 min.**

Family Matters (2006)

Caregivers and family members are given guideposts to help them understand what to expect along the Alzheimer's journey with a loved one. **27 min.**

Favorite Things

A respite video shows segments involving a dog, a baby and a vegetable garden. Audience participation is encouraged. **33 min.**

Forget Me Never

Based on the book "Living in the Labyrinth", by Diana McGowin. This video chronicles early-onset Alzheimer's disease. McGowin formed the first early-onset support group. She and a former English professor, Richard Badessa, met in the support group and went on to crusade for more research and affordable long-term care. **15 min.**

The Forgetting: A Portrait of Alzheimer's (2003)

The PBS documentary that looks at the growing epidemic of Alzheimer's. A half-hour follow-up, narrated by David Hyde Pierce, includes experts who provide practical advice on coping with Alzheimer's disease. **2 hrs** (VHS and DVD)

Freedom of Sexual Expression: Dementia and Resident Rights in Long-Term Care Facilities (2002)

This video emphasizes that sexuality and intimacy are a basic human right for nursing home residents. It demonstrates various sexual expressions and how they may affect other residents, staff and guests. Also discussed are strategies for dealing with inappropriate sexual behaviors and policies and procedures on patients' rights with regard to sexual expression. **16 min.**

Golden Years (1989)

Stories of elder abuse in the words of the survivors. **5 min.**

Gonna Do A Little Music (1993)

A music therapist introduces musical instruments and plays each one. Viewers are invited to sing along.

Grace (1992)

An Emmy Award- winning video telling the story of Grace Kirkland who has a progressive dementia disorder. This video covers a seven year journey from the time Grace begins having trouble with short-term memory. **58 min.**

Hana – Ichimonme

This Japanese language film illustrates how Alzheimer's disease affects an entire family.

The Heart Has No Wrinkles (1988)

This drama is set in a retirement hotel where two people are in the early stages of forming a relationship. This film addresses various misconceptions about sexuality and the elderly. A discussion guide is included. **16 min.**

Helping People with Dementia in Activities of Daily Living (1986)

This is a slide-tape presentation produced on video, demonstrating techniques for helping people with Alzheimer's and other dementias continue to carry out activities of daily life such as dressing, grooming and performing simple household chores. **21 min.**

He's Doing This to Spite Me: Emotional Conflicts in Dementia Care (2000)

Suggestions for ways to change caregiver methods when dealing with Alzheimer's patients who exhibit difficult-to-manage behaviors. Caregivers share their experiences and feelings and dementia expert Daniel Kuhn emphasizes that persons with dementia are not responsible and that it is healthy for caregivers to express difficult feelings with others and accept what cannot be changed. **22 min.**

Hi, Buddy: The Developmentally Delayed Individual with Alzheimer's Disease (1988)

This video deals with a population at high risk for developing Alzheimer's disease, those with Down syndrome. This is the story of 53 year old Roger who is in the early stages of Alzheimer's. This video helps caregivers understand the symptoms and progression of AD in people with Down syndrome. **18 min.**

How to Choose a Nursing Home (1997)

Detailed information on how to select a long-term care facility, including questions to ask. Information about safety, costs and Medicare and Medicaid is included. **26 min.**

How to Communicate with Someone Who Has DVD Alzheimer's Disease or Related Dementia (1999)

Topics include repetitive questions, doing chores, aggressive behavior, answering difficult questions and the use of language and other forms of communication. Experts on Alzheimer's disease are interviewed and suggest ways for caregivers to meet the special challenges of dementia. **30 min.**

I Know a Song (1988)

A filmmaker documents her mother's decline with Alzheimer's disease. This film shows the continued loving relationship between mother and daughter. An upbeat film for caregivers, both professional and family. **24 min.**

In the Moment (1997)

This is a look at how two different families deal with the stresses involved in caring for a parent that has

Alzheimer's. One family cares for their loved one in-home and other makes the decision to place their

mother in a nursing home after home care becomes too difficult. **25 min.**

In This Very Room (1993)

Older adults with dementia are shown interacting with professionals who are engaging them in music, dance, visual art and creative dramatics. **12 min.**

Innocent Offender

This is a training video for law enforcement employees which shows some of the behaviors of Alzheimer's sufferers that might be misinterpreted as criminal behavior. Ways in which police officers should handle such situations are demonstrated. **15 min.**

Interacting With Alzheimer's Patients: Tips for Family and Friends (2 tapes)

1. Recognizing and Preventing Caregiver Burnout. 23 min.

Psychiatrist Peter V. Rabins addresses caregiver personality changes, depression, frustration, feelings of hopelessness, social isolation and suggests ways to prevent caregiver burnout.

2. Alzheimer's Disease Do's and Don'ts. 26 min.

This topic brings together Alzheimer caregivers. The discussion, led by Dr. Rabins, offers emotional and practical insight to care giving. The importance of support groups is stressed. This tape is appropriate for use in support groups or for individual viewing.

Iris (2001)

After providing a basic understanding of dementia, this set of videos demonstrates techniques of communication for caregivers. **105 min.**

Just for the Summer (1990)

A high school student learns about Alzheimer's disease when his grandmother comes to stay with his family. During her visit he comes to better understand her disease and grows more sensitive to her struggle. A curriculum guide is also available for use with this video. See Kits section. **30 min.**

Kibitz With David (1994)

The host of this video attempts to bring back memories of a childhood of rich Jewish customs through conversation and songs. **60 min.**

Ladies, Let's Chat (1994)

Diane uses songs and conversation to bring back pleasant memories. **43 min.**

Learning to Speak Alzheimer's: An Introduction to the Habilitation Approach to Care DVD

Habilitation is caregiving that embraces the remaining abilities of the person with dementia. This approach will help caregivers communicate better with persons with Alzheimer's and improve the quality of life of the patient. For use in nursing home, assisted living and home settings. **32 min.**

This video was designed to help educate law enforcement and emergency responders about wandering behavior and how to efficiently respond to a wandering incident. Several officers discuss how they have successfully used Safe Return to reunite memory-impaired adults with loved ones. **13 min.**

A dementia care training consultant explains how to provide individual activities for people with dementia to heighten their sense of self-esteem. **83 min.**

Solving Bathing Problems in Persons with Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders (1996)

Just for the Summer

A high school student learns about Alzheimer's disease when his grandmother comes to stay with his family. During her visit, he comes to better understand her disease and grows more sensitive to her struggle. A curriculum guide and reproducible fact sheets produced by the Alzheimer's Association are included for use with this video which is 30 minutes long. (See video list.)

Mentors in Memory, 2nd edition (2003)

An interdisciplinary CE-certified training program designed to aid in the recognition and management of dementia in skilled nursing facilities. Included, in a loose-leaf format, are study sheets, a 40 minute video, slides, and CD-ROMs. Special sections are aimed at consultant pharmacists, nurses and CNAs.

Moments: Avenues to Discussion and Cognitive Stimulation (1990)

Simple questions or activities appear on the reverse of each card. These could be used in group settings or on an individual basis at home.
