

Guardianship

This training will provide a basic explanation of guardianship of elderly persons and the process by which it takes place. Participants will learn when guardianship is appropriate; who are guardians, and what are the limits of their power and responsibility; what is the power and responsibility of the court; can guardians be changed, and if so, how; what happens when persons have not chosen a power of attorney; or worse, when they have and the person making decisions is doing so in their own interests rather than in the best interests of the elderly person.
