6. Checked dress with cap sleeves. Attach cancelled checks all over the body of the dress and pin a baseball cap to each shoulder.
7. Seersucker dress. Attach candy suckers all over a dress.
8. House dress. Decorate a dress with pictures of houses.
9. Box suit with piping trim. Use a large cardboard box and attach a plastic water pipe to the bottom.
10. Tea dress. Attach tea bags to a dress. Use a tea kettle as a handbag. Jewelry might include tea bag earrings and necklace.
11. Bathing suit. Attach a variety of bathing items to a suit. Suggestions: a wash cloth, travel-size soaps, shampoo, and conditioner - be creative.
12. Spaghetti strap dress with plunging neckline and bare back. Attach cooked spaghetti (lasagna shows up well) over both shoulders of a long dress. Attach a teddy bear to the back of the dress. Tie a plunger around the model's neck.



13. Ball gown with spike-heeled shoes. Attach balls and balloons to a long dress. Attach golf tees to the heel section of a pair of shoes.
14. Wedding dress with scoop neckline, tab waistline, and long train. Attach an ice cream scoop at the neckline or have the model wear an ice cream scoop tied around her neck. Attach empty Tab soft drink cans at the waistline. Have the model pull a toy train, or attach a toy train to the hemline of the dress.
15. How about a birthday suit? A suit with birthday candles, balloons, and small wrapped gifts attached.

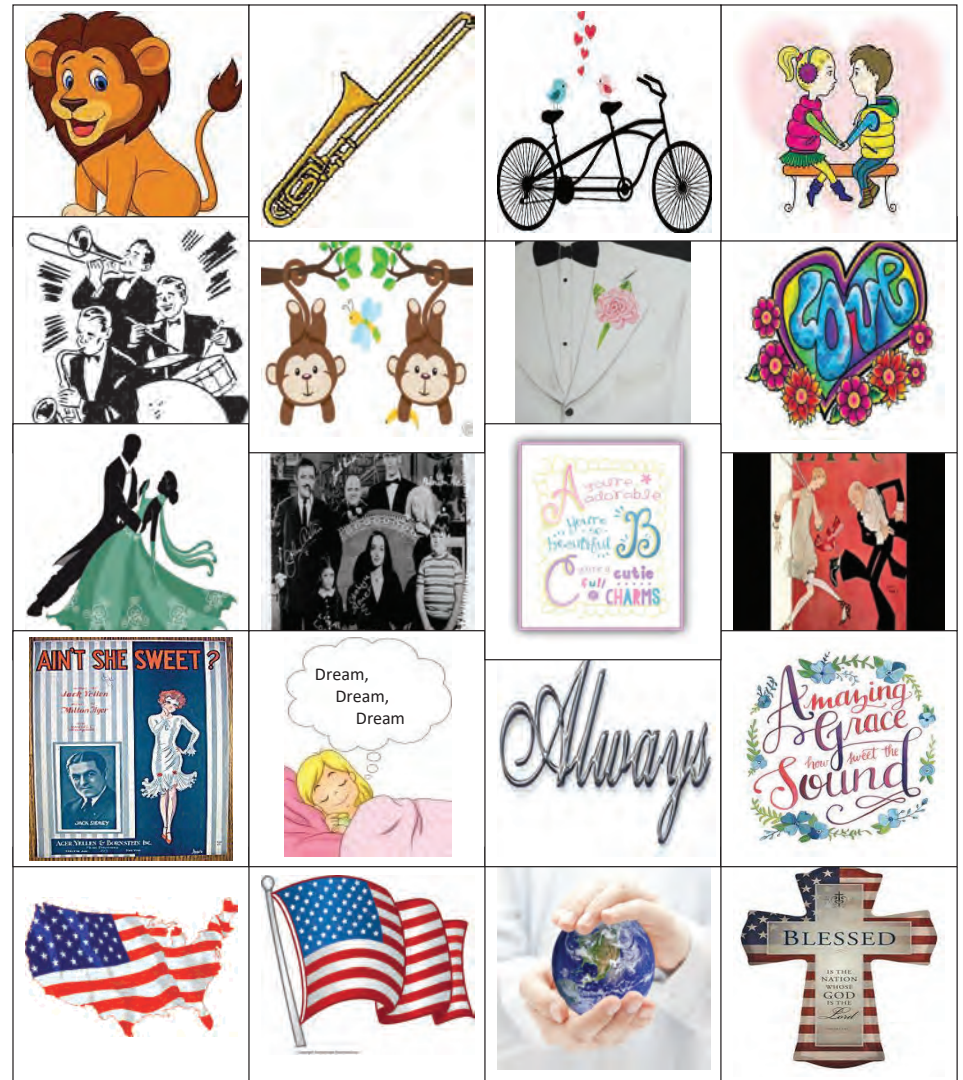

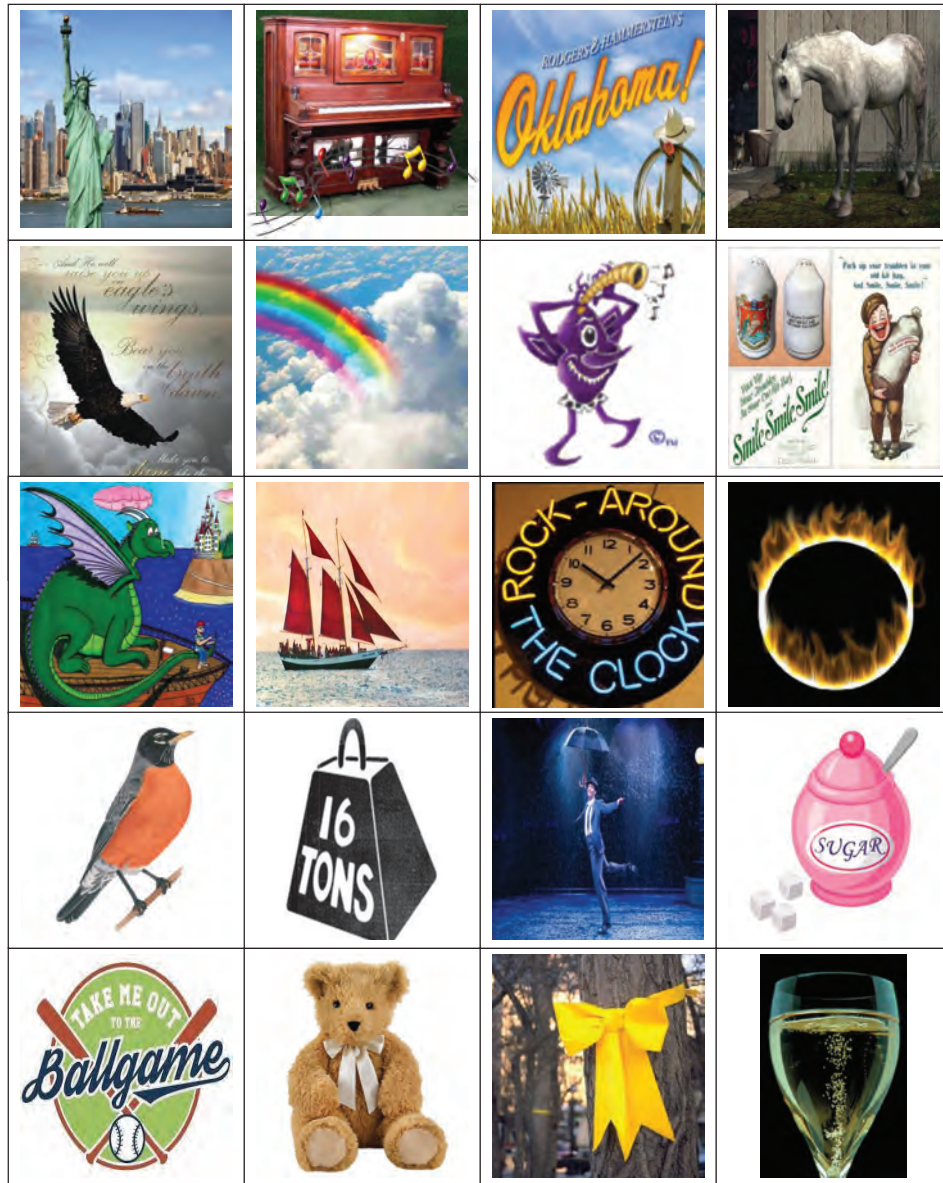

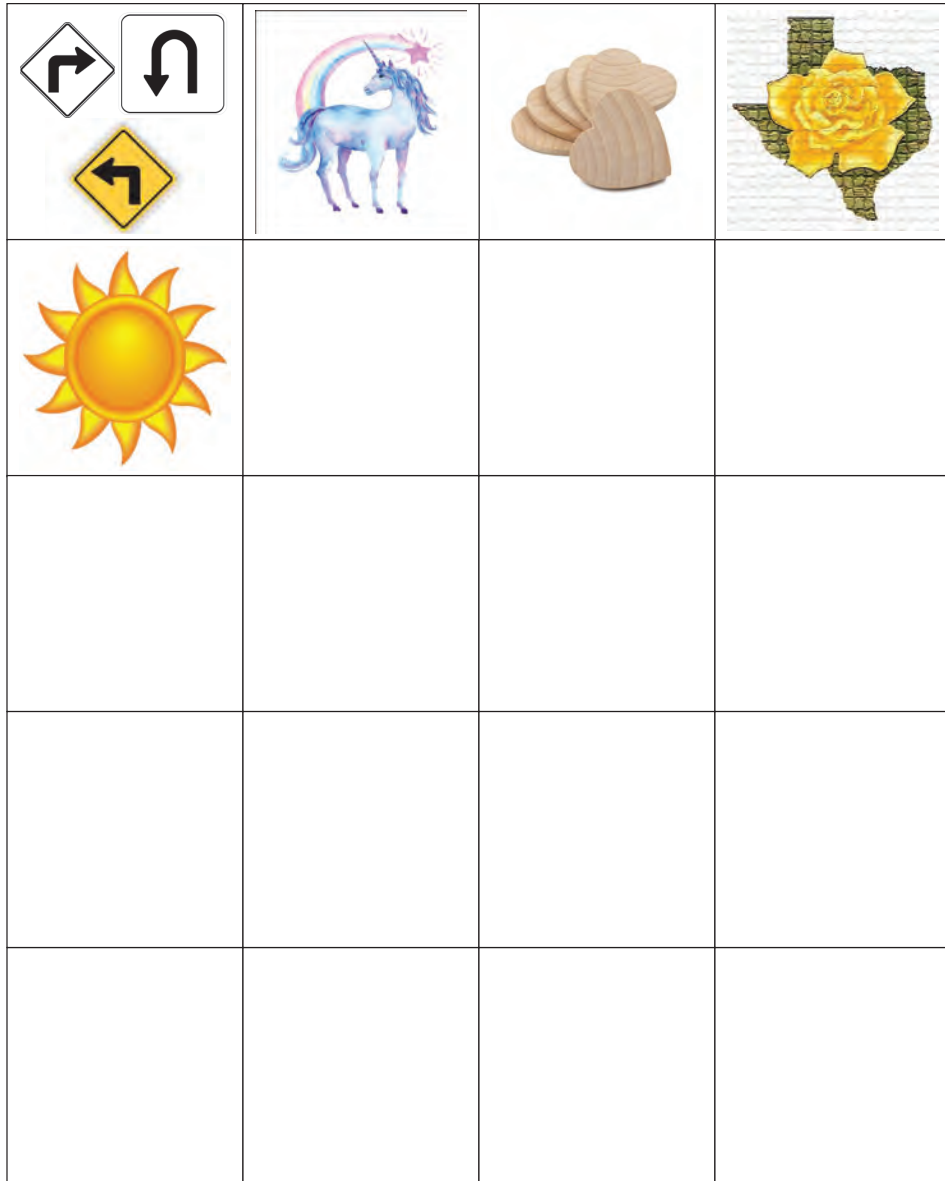
