More than 1 in 4 caregivers in Michigan (25.6%) is providing care to an individual with Alzheimer's or other form of dementia.

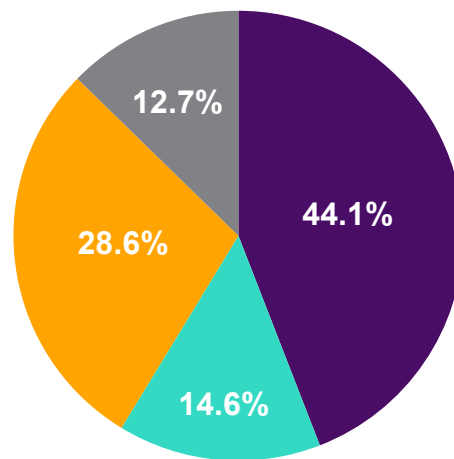

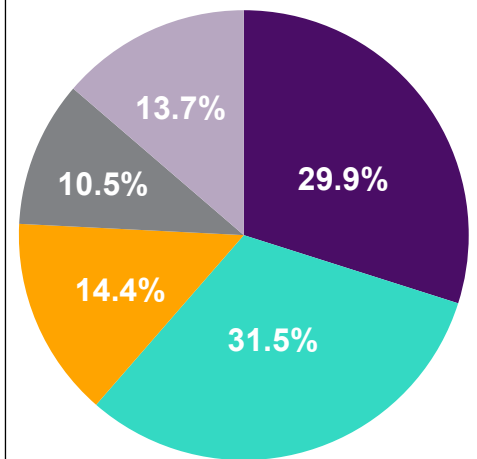
In frequent poor physical health	11.8%

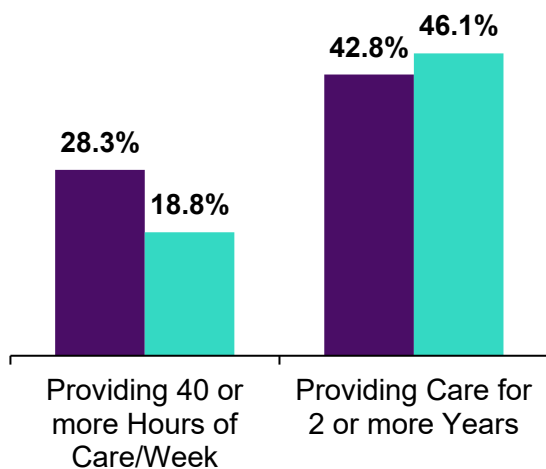

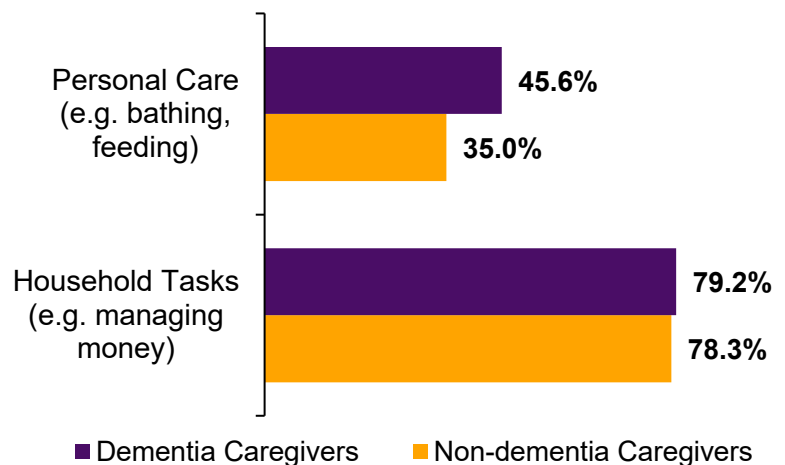
