Nearly 1 in 5 caregivers in Nevada (19.6%) is providing care to an individual with Alzheimer's or other form of dementia.

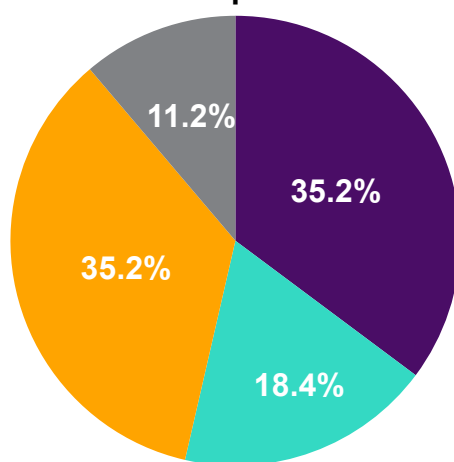
## Who are dementia caregivers?

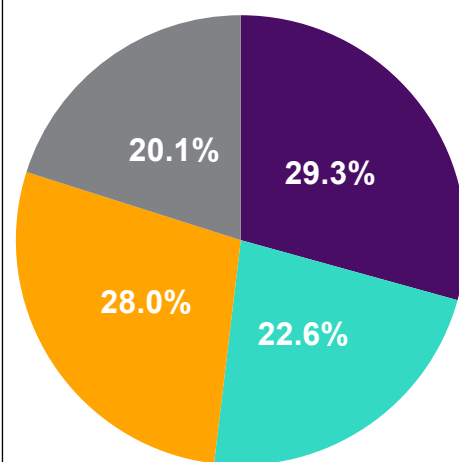

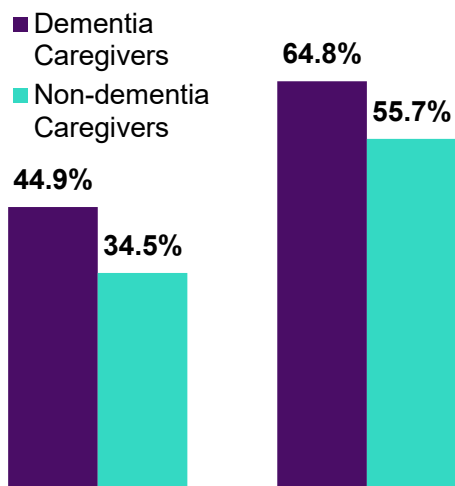

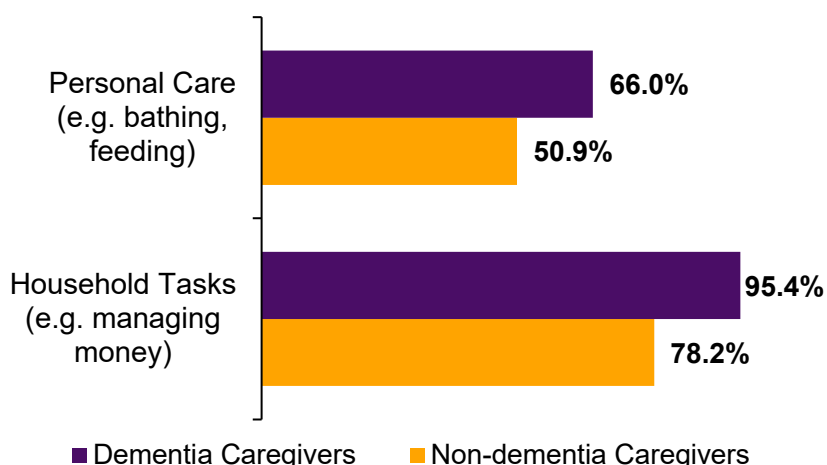
### Length of Care
