More than 1 in 5 caregivers in Wisconsin (22.6%) is providing care to an individual with Alzheimer's or other form of dementia.

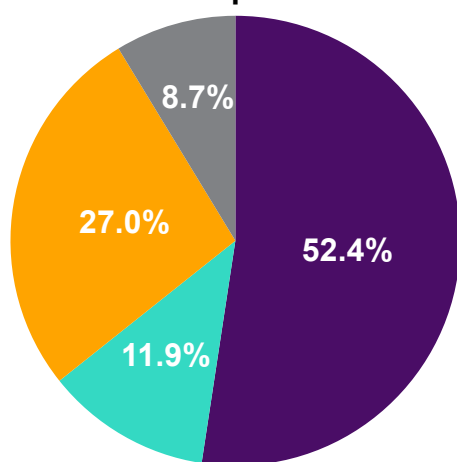

Health Effects

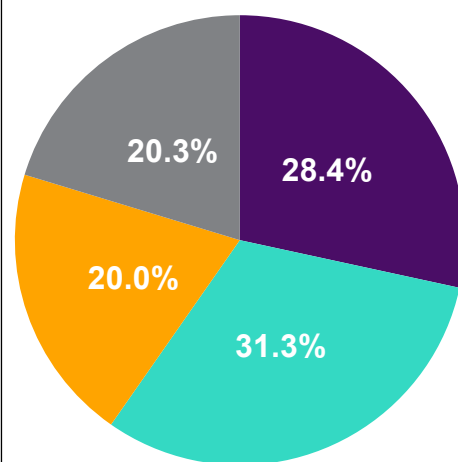
In frequent poor physical health	10.5%

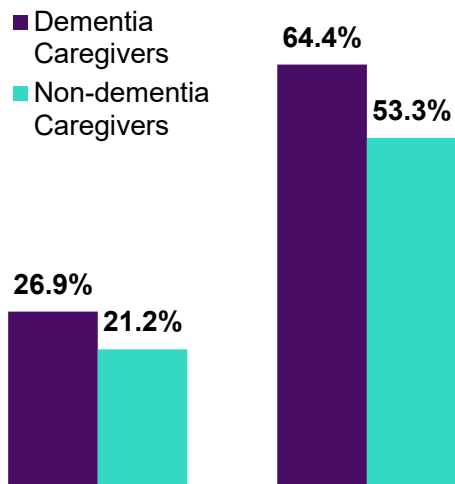

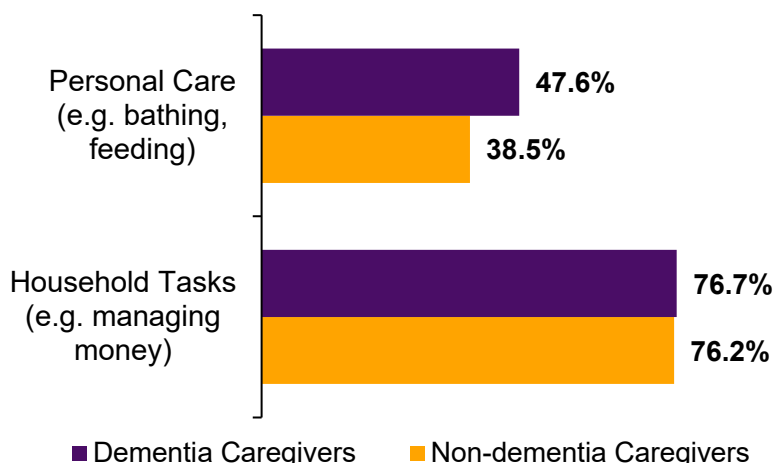
Length of Care
