Overview

Join us for an immersion workshop that will introduce the AD Knowledge Portal and Agora, two sites for exploring multi-omic data and results for Alzheimer's disease. The workshop will provide an overview of the AD Knowledge Portal infrastructure, how to find data of interest, and how to download and prepare data for downstream analyses. We will also present an overview of three complementary results explorers: Agora, AD Atlas, and Model AD Explorer.

The lecture and demo will be followed by an optional hands-on session in which users will have an opportunity to practice what they've learned and get 1:1 help with the Portal, Agora, AD Atlas, and Model AD Explorer.

Learning Objectives

- Be able to search for data in the AD Knowledge Portal.
- Understand metadata and how to combine it with data in the Portal.
- Be able to download data into R studio for downstream visualization and analysis.
- Be able to explore curated AD omics results using Agora, AD Atlas and Model AD Explorer.

Sessions 1 and 2: Any researcher interested in better understanding how to find and explore molecular and other omic data to enable their research AD. A basic understanding of bioinformatics data types will be helpful, but no additional technical or statistical skills are necessary.

Session 3: Researchers wishing to participate in Session 3 will need a laptop and access to R studio. Basic understanding of data manipulation using Python and R will be beneficial.
