
DATA FROM THE 2020 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In Oregon, <u>nearly 60%</u> of all adults providing unpaid care to loved ones with Alzheimer's or another dementia have been doing so for at least two years.


<u>Nearly 40%</u> of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide 20 or more hours of care per week.


Nearly one in five dementia caregivers are in the "sandwich generation" — caring for both someone with dementia and a child or grandchild.
