


DATA FROM THE 2016 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In South Dakota, <u>nearly 60 percent</u> of all adults providing unpaid care to loved ones with Alzheimer's or another dementia have been doing so for at least two years.

Among Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers, <u>60 percent are men</u>, and <u>more than</u> <u>one-third</u> provide care to their parent or their parent-in-law.


<u>Nearly half</u> of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide burdensome personal care, such as feeding or bathing.
