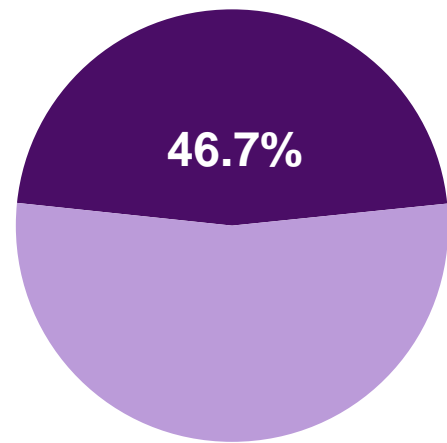
DATA FROM THE 2015 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In Utah, nearly half of all adults providing unpaid care to loved ones with Alzheimer's or another dementia have been doing so for at least two years.

Nearly half of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide 9 or more hours of care per week.

Among Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers, more than one in every three provide care to their parent or their parent-in-law.

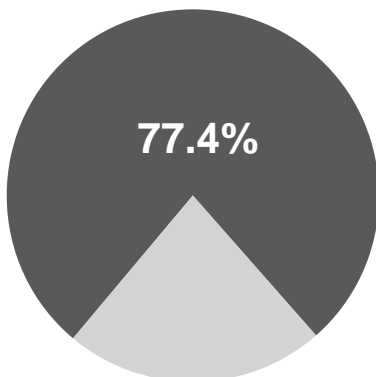
Percent of dementia caregivers providing care for at least 2 years
