# COMMUNITY CONNECT PROGRAMS

## AFTERNOON AT THE ANTON

Afternoon at the Anton is a free program done in collaboration with the Anton Art Center. During the program we will have a facilitated art discussion followed by art creation in the studio. No artistic experience is required! Pre-registration is required one week in advance.

## CIDER MILL OUTINGS

At Yates Cider Mill, we will be taking a tour to watch the cider being pressed and a short movie to see some behind-the-scenes operation.

## DETROIT HISTORICAL MUSEUM

Detroit's vibrant Southwest neighborhood comes to life in our new Community Gallery exhibition. For the past 100 years, this neighborhood has been the seat of Detroit's Mexican-American community and has been an essential part of the Detroit story. Join us for this talk as we discover the history of this cultural gem and learn why southwest Detroit really shines, "Esoque ni que!"

## DETROIT SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA PARTNERED EVENTS

Join us for a series of events with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra (DSO)! Organized with a person with dementia in mind, our outings give you an upfront and behind-the-scenes look at the DSO.

## EARLY-STAGE SOCIAL CLUB

The Early-Stage Social Club is a recreational program that promotes cognitive, physical and social well-being for individuals in the early stages of Alzheimer's disease or another dementia. Meetings feature free chair yoga followed by a coffee social and participant driven activities.

## MEET ME @ THE BBAC

Meet Me @ the BBAC (Birmingham Bloomfield Art Center) is an ongoing program for people living with Alzheimer's disease and other dementias and their care partners to create meaningful experiences together through art. Join us for facilitated discussion and art studio time. RSVP required by the Tuesday before the event.

## MEMORY CAFÉS

Our memory cafés are a gathering of people living in all stages of dementia and their care partners. They create an opportunity to spend time together in a welcoming place sharing stories with others who are living a similar journey. Food is available for purchase at Mimi's Bistro and the Clawson Grill. Lunch and an activity are provided at the Livonia Memory Café.

## MINDS IN THE WILD AT THE DETROIT ZOO

Slither, hop, fly or walk! Join us at the Detroit Zoo in Royal Oak for Minds in the Wild, where we will enjoy themed visits lead by Zoo staff. We will gather to learn and share. Join us for this monthly outing where we explore different exhibits and animal groups each month!

## MINDS ON ART

Minds on Art, done in collaboration with the Detroit Institute of Arts, is a free, five-week program for people living with Alzheimer's disease and other dementias and a companion. No artistic experience required.

## THE HENRY FORD OUTINGS

This month, we will be joined by The Henry Ford's Curator of Decorative Arts, Charles Sable, for a tour of the Davidson-Gerson Gallery of Glass in Greenfield Village. The tour will cover everything from the beginnings of glass-making in America through the current trends in studio glass. We will look at glass used in American homes throughout the 19th and 20th centuries, paying special attention to cut and engraved decorative glass that most people had and still have at home, as well as decorative art glass. We will also look at more utilitarian glass like Corning ware, soda bottles and even Heinz ketchup bottles.
